# AL still working on single candidates

To sit with 14-party allies for sharing some seats

Ruling Awami League is yet to finalise party candidates for a number of municipalities and negotiate with allies over sharing seats in the next month's municipal polls.

In many municipalities, more than one party man submitted their candidacies, said Awami League insiders. The candidates include relatives of ministers, lawmakers and some other top leaders.

Awami League will submit today a list of prospective candidates to Prime Minister and its President Sheikh Hasina who has already asked other top leaders not to have their relatives nominated for the elections.

Sheikh Hasina would approve the list in consultation with the party's organising secretaries who had prepared it after talking to grassroots leaders.

Once the list is finalised, the party would convey its decision to the rejected candidates and ask them to work for those nominated by the high command.

"We will finally try to support a single candidate for each municipality and urge the rebel candidates to withdraw their candidacies," AL Presidium Member Kazi Zafarullah told The Daily Star.

The government will start to distribute food grains among the ultra poor under Fair Price Card (FPC) and Ration System from the new year.

A parliamentary body yesterday said microcredit programmes help eradicate the country's poverty in spite of an "inadequate and very weak" regulatory system. The parliamentary standing committee on finance ministry

the regulatory system which is very weak at present," AHM Mostafa Kamal, chief of the watchdog, told reporters after a meeting at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban. Giving a brief description of microcredit programmes, Mostafa Kamal, popularly known as Lotus Kamal, said

microcredit has spread its wings in different countries and cities including New York where it is working to change the poor's economic condition. On recent allegations published in a section of media against Nobel laureate Dr Muhammad Yunus and Grameen Bank, Lotus Kamal said they did not discuss anything against any individual

or institution. He however said high officials of the finance ministry have informed them that a high-powered committee would be formed soon to investigate the allegations.


Lt Col Ziaul Ahsan, chief of Rab intelligence wing, told The Daily Star that they
