



To mark the 96th birth anniversary of Shilpacharya Zainul Abedin, Faculty of Fine Arts (FFA), University of Dhaka is holding a three-day 'Zainul Festival' at the FFA premises.

The festival begins today and will continue till December 31. The event will include a 'pitha utshab' (rice cake fair), painting exhibition, discussion, procession, award-giving programme and highlight traditional artisans. Vice-chancellor of Dhaka University Professor AAMS Arefin Siddique

will inaugurate the festival. Jahanara Abedin (widow of Zainul Abedin) will be present as special guest on the occasion. Professor Matlub Ali, Dean of FFA, will preside over the programme.

As part of the 'Zainul Festival', Dhaka University will honour Mohammad Kibria and veteran Japanese printmaker Noriko Yanagisawa. The latter is a Professor at Musashino University, Japan.

As part of the festival, FFA is also going to hold a ten-day group art exhibition at Zainul Gallery where teachers and students will be participating. Students will exhibit their artworks including prints, paintings and sculptures at the faculty premises. Traditional artisans will display their crafts --Lakkhishora, Shokher Hari, Shika, Shola and more. The artisans are coming from Rajshahi, Manikganj, Nawabganj and other parts of the country.



Srabon Reza's Quest for Rhythm


A six daylong exhibition featuring up and coming photographer Srabon Reza, titled "Quest for Rhythm", was held recently at Drik Gallery in Dhanmondi, Dhaka.

The photographs on display indicated that the photographer is an ardent admirer of nature and has sought harmony and rhythm in its splendour.


"There is a growing lack of concern -- in the urban society -- for love, cooperation and other human values. Life is so struggleridden here that sometimes it seems that we have forgotten how to take a deep breath and relax. What's more disconcerting is that we don't even have the time to contemplate what this whole business of 'living' has turned us into," said Reza. He added, "I don't think it's right to be so pessimistic and give into frustration. You can see this exhibition as one photographer's attempt to seek the emotions and values that we once cherished in the warmth of nature."

Looking at Reza's photographs, one has to admire his sense of aesthetics. Most of the photos, particularly the ones of flowers that have fallen from the trees and foliage, demonstrate the photographer's mastery over light and shade. Symbolism is evident in some of the photos. "Insecure Journey", for example, is a beautiful composition. In the photo, an ant walking on a barbwire symbolises the uncertainties of a man's life in today's world.

In short, at the exhibition, Reza has not only showcased his skills as a photographer but also his maturity of imagination.


Every participant will also be given a certificate. The prize giving ceremony will be held today at the gallery auditorium,

"Bhawaiya is not just music. It is the melodic articulation of a woman's heartache," Abbasi said about the songs.
