Fine slapped on realtor

A real estate company has been fined about Tk 3 crore for wiping out hills and forests on an area of 100 acres to develop a housing project at Jhilongja in Cox's Bazar.

The Department of Environment in a drive yesterday slapped the fine on Uttaran Grihayan Samabai Samity and shut down the project only two kilometres off the Cox's Bazar town.

A huge quantity of construction materials and equipment were seized from the project area. No arrests could be made as all company officials and workers had already

fled the place before the drive, said DoE officials. They said the realtor had sold 600 people housing

plots under the project, about 80 feet above the sea level. Frequent hill cutting in Cox's Bazar has posed a threat

Mishandling costs 500 jobs

Around 500 Bangladeshi jobseekers will not get jobs in South Korea allegedly for inefficient handling of their applications by the government recruiting agency, BOESL.

They have been waiting for visas for over two years after completing all the initial procedures including

passing a Korean language test.

Bangladesh Overseas **Employment Services Limited** (BOESL) in a notice on December 19 last year said Korea's Human Resources Department (HRD) has deleted names of 493 successful candidates from the list sent by

BOESL. Some were excluded as the two-

year period of their Korean language test certificate expired and some others for being overage, the BOESL website read.

The jobseekers, however, say nearly 1,500 other jobseekers who passed the same test in October 2008 are still on the list.

They said they have evidence that
