




When Your Body is the Canvas

For as long as I can remember, I've had acute belonephobia (fear of needles). This was my way of confronting that fear. I'd thought long and hard. I wanted a tattoo, and I was finally getting My tattoo artist is a self-taught

prodigy. At 19, he has done 48 tattoos (of them, 8 large ones). Son of artist parents, drawing and painting obviously run in his blood. But to be a good tattoo artist you need to have killer skills. When someone is paying you to have his/her skin perforated, for an artwork that'll permanently remain on the skin (there is laser tattoo removal, but it's way more painful than getting a tattoo), there is no room for errors. Sadman Touhid Olin claims to be

first "real" tattooist in Bangladesh. There are few places in Dhaka that do tattoos, says Olin. "However, either the artists are not that good or they have very few designs they can




