### 3 outlaws held, arms seized

Police arrested three members of outlawed Purbabangla Communist Party (PBCP) Red Flag faction from the remote Ranigram village yesterday afternoon. A firearm and ammunition were also seized from them. The arrestees were identified as Mohammed Ali, 25, Motalab Hossain, 26, and Md Bakul Hossain, 30, of village Haripur of Ataikula union in Pabna Sadar upazila. They are hardened operatives of outlawed PBCP red flag faction and associates of Tikka Bahini, police said. Officer-in-charge (OC) of Ataikula police station Md Habibul Islam said following a secret information, a team raided Ranigram village in the afternoon when the criminals were holding a secret meeting at a house in the village.

### Man killed by brother

A man was killed allegedly by his brother following dispute over a piece of land at Shikharpur village in the upazila on Monday morning. Sources said, there was a longstanding dispute between Habib Ali, 46, and Nur Uddin, 43, sons of Koti Mia of the village over the land. On Monday morning, when Nur uddin went to the disputed land to set up a toilet, elder brother Habib Ali tried to resist him which triggered a clash. At one stage, Habib Ali's wife Asia Begum and his sons joined with him and beat Nur Uddin mercilessly, leaving him dead on the spot.

## Clashes in four districts leave 3 killed, 70 hurt

Three people were killed and 70 others injured in clashes in Kurigram, Sunamganj, Sirajganj and Kishoreganj districts yesterday and on Saturday.

One person was killed and 20 were injured in a bloody clash over a piece of disputed land at Buraburi union under Ulipur upazila of Kurigram yesterday, reports our correspondent.

The deceased was identified as Abu Bakar Siddik, 47, son of late Akbar Ali of Fakir Para village under the union.

According to police and locals there was a long-standing dispute between Abu Bakar Siddik group and Shahidul Islam group over a 24-decimal land in Fakir Para village.

Yesterday, at around 6:00am both the groups locked in clash with sharp weapons in which 20 from both sides were injured.

Of the injured, Abu Bakar

Siddik died at Kurigram Sadar Hospital at about 9:00am.

In Sunamganj, 20 people including 7 policemen sustained injuries in a clash over a jalmahal (water body) in Dharmapasha upazila yesterday afternoon.

Police lobbed 12 tear gas shells and fired 15 rubber bullets to bring the situation under control, reports our staff correspondent in Sylhet.

Locals and police said, the clash ensued at about 3pm as a group of hired fishermen belonging to one Ruhul Amin attempted to take possession of the water body known as Bade Madhyanagar Rupeshwar Jalmahal. Earlier it was under the possession of their rival Kader Member's people.

Both the groups used lethal weapons during the clash, police said.

Officer-in-charge of Dharmapasha PS Kazi Bazle Moula told this correspon-

dent that locals swooped on the police contingent as the law enforcers reached the area by engine boats.

In Sirajganj, a trader was killed and 15 farmers were injured in an attack by their rivals at Dahokola village in Ullapara upazila on Saturday.

The deceased was identified as Nazrul Islam, 40, of the village, reports UNB.

Locals said Nazrul along with a group of farmers went to a field in the morning to install a shallow machine for irrigation.

At one stage a gang allegedly led by Iqbal, Mamun, Ejarot, Kanon, Swapan equipped with lethal weapons attacked, leaving Nazrul killed on the spot and others injured.

In, Kishoreganj, a man was killed and 15 others were injured in a bloody clash between two groups over a piece of land at Noagaon in Kotiadi upazila on Saturday.

The deceased was identified as Tajul Islam.

Police said Tajul had enmity with his cousin Saiful Islam over the boundary line of a piece of land.

A clash ensued between the supporters of Tajul and Saiful over the land Saturday evening that left Tajul seriously wounded. Later, he succumbed to his injuries at Sadar hospital.

## Airport at Arial Beel demanded

UNB, Munshiganj

A human chain was formed on Dhaka-Mawa Highway yesterday morning demanding construction of Bangabandhu Airport at Arial Beel.

A large number of people from different professions also brought out procession and took part in the 20-km long human chain that stretched from Old Ferry Terminal to Kuchiamora in Srinagar upazila.

Addressing a brief rally at Nimtoli point, the speakers said that condition of people of this area would improve, their scope for employment will increase while the area would turn into a commercial hub if the airport is constructed at Arial Beel.

The government decided to construct modern Bangabandhu Airport on 25,000 acres of land at Arial Beel, a water body which encompasses Srinagar upazila of Munshiganj and Nababganj and Dohar of Dhaka.

A section of local people protested the government's decision and held different programmes to air their opposition.

## BSF kidnaps 4 Bangladeshis

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) abducted four Bangladeshi fishermen from Kachhikata area of River Roymongal in the Sundarbans on Friday.

The fishermen are now detained in Basirhat jail, according to a report received here yesterday. They are Azizul Dhali, 46, son of Ahsan Dhali, Abdur Rouf Dhali, 21, and Bakkar Dhali, 14, sons of Azizul Dhali and Auranga Gazi, 38, son of Abul Hossain of village Tengrakhal in Shyamnagar upazila.

The fishermen went to the Sundarbans for fishing after duly taking pass from the Kalkhali forest office in the Sundarbans on December 23.

BSF men of Shamsheernagar camp in India entered Bangladesh territory and abducted them while they were catching fish at Kachhikata in Shyamnagar upazila.

Later the Indian border guards handed them to Basirhat police and since then they have been

detained there.

An Indian national yesterday over cell phone confirmed their detention in Basirhat jail, victim Auranga Gazi's father Abul Hossain said.

Kalkhali union parishad (UP) member Abdul Bari said the four fishermen went missing on December 31. He said they will inform the matter to BDR soon.

Meanwhile, body of an Indian national, killed by Border Security Force (BSF) on Friday on Pakirdanga border under Basirhat PS in India opposite to Bhomra, was handed over to BSF after a flag meeting yesterday evening.

BSF members of Pakirdanga Hakimpur camp arrested Indian national Bappi Mondal, 35, of village Pakirdanga in India on December 31 and tortured him severely at night.

Later the BSF men left seriously injured Bappi Mondal inside Bangladesh territory near Pillar No-3 near at Bhomra presuming him dead.

The victim succumbed to his injuries soon after BDR men rescued him the next morning.
