elderly mother in New York recently, in front of several news crews.

He told "Today" he became known among drivers in Columbus, Ohio who would drive by just to hear his golden voice and upbeat greeting while advertising his "God-given gift

of voice" when panhandling. But now, with job offers pouring in, he said he hoped five years on he could become a radio programme director and support his daughters and sons in Columbus.

The lesson on treating the homeless, he said, was simple: "Don't judge a book by its cover, everybody has their own little story."
