The prospect of the 2022 Qatar World Cup being held in the winter moved a step closer Friday when FIFA president Sepp Blatter said for the first time that this is what he expects will happen.

Qatar was controversially awarded the right to host the tournament last month despite summer temperatures in the Gulf emirate soaring to well over 40 degrees Celsius.

Concerns have been raised about the health impacts of playing in such searing heat, as well for the fans following the action, and Blatter said winter would make more sense.

"I expect it to be in the winter because when you play football you must protect the main people, the players, he said at a media roundtable in the Qatari capital Doha ahead of the Asian Cup, which kicks off later Friday.

"We will take it up at our executive committee meeting in March."

German legend Franz Beckenbauer, a FIFA executive committee member, and England coach Fabio Capello are among others who have voiced support for a switch of dates.

UEFA president Michel Platini is also said to be sympathetic to the idea, with January temperatures hovering between a more comfortable 20 and 30 Celsius.

But any change would have major implications for domestic competitions in Britain and the rest of Europe where the league programmes would be in full swing.

Quagliarella out for season

Juventus and Italy striker Fabio Quagliarella's season is over after tests on Friday revealed he has torn a cruciate knee ligament. The 27-year-old was

stretchered off early during Thursday's humbling 4-1 home defeat to Parma that left Juve eight points off the top of the Serie A table in fifth.

And they suffered a further blow with the news that Quagliarella's cruciate ligament has been torn meaning he faces four to six months on the sidelines.

Juve have moved to replace Quagliarella with veteran former Italy forward Luca Toni, according to Italian press reports.

Toni is due to undergo a medical on Friday afternoon before the official announcement of his signing.

However, if his signing is a boost, there was worse news as Brazil midfielder Felipe Melo was banned for three games for his dismissal against Parma for kicking Massimo Paci in the face.

Real lose, still make last 8

Real Madrid, cushioned by an 8-0 first leg lead, secured their place in the Spanish Cup quarterfinals on Thursday despite a 2-0 defeat in the return match at Levante. Levante's two second-half goals by Xisco Nadal and

Sergio Gonzalez were not enough to overturn Real's huge advantage secured over the Valencia-based side last month and the Spanish giants pushed through 8-2 on aggregate. Last season's runners-up Atletico Madrid, who took a

1-0 lead to Espanyol, made it through to the last eight after clinching a 1-1 draw to wrap up a 2-1 aggregate win. Betis ended the hopes of top-flight Getafe with a 3-1

win that overturned the Madrid's club's 2-1 advantage from last month's first leg. The Seville-based side are now the only lower-tier club left in the competition. Centre forward Jorge Molina sprinted through and

struck the ball past Getafe keeper Oscar Ustari in the 56th minute to open the scoring for Betis.

Betis striker Ruben Castrol netted twice more and Getafe substitute Francisco Casquero scored his side's only goal, allowing the Seville-based team to advance 4-3 on aggregate.

"As a first division side we have had the tendency to relax. We only reacted when we went 2-0 down. They were much better than us. We have been humbled," said Getafe coach Michel Gonzalez.

Almeria scored four first-half goals in a 4-3 win at Mallorca to advance 8-6 on aggregate while Villarreal made it to the quarterfinals after defeating Valencia 4-2 following their goalless draw last month.
