**PM asks army to earn people's trust**

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has asked the armed forces to gain the trust of the masses, and preserve it in view of its importance.

"Remember, the people are the strength of the country, and you are a part of these people. So it is very important to gain their trust and preserve it," she said at the Darbar 66 Infantry Division of Bangladesh Army after witnessing their winter exercise.

She said the Bangladesh Army has always played a sparkling role for the country whenever it has been needed, apart from their professional activities and training.

She especially mentioned the role of the Army in preparing photographed voter lists and identity cards. "The Army always remains beside the people of the country during various natural calamities," she said.

Hasina said the present government is working restlessly to develop the socio-economic conditions of the people along with the

development of the Army.

Describing the present government's various initiatives for welfare of the armed forces, she said, "Let me assure you, as in our previous tenure, the present government is implementing various types of projects for the army and their family members."

In this connection she said this time the government has introduced a new pay scale and increased ration for the army to bring it up to par with the Navy and the Air Force.

She also said the pension rate and medical allowance for the retired dead army soldiers have been increased. "We have also taken steps to mitigate the accommodation problems of armed forces at all levels," she said.

Hasina reaffirmed her government's commitment to make the army a modern, skilful and time-befitting force.

She said the strategic importance of the areas under the 66 Infantry Division of Bangladesh Army is crucial, considering the

national economy and security. "Especially, the presence of huge coal and hard rock mines attaches more importance to this area. It is your prime duty to ensure the security of the area," she said.

She said she was happy to know that like the previous times the winter exercise of this year also included Ansar and BNCC cadets.

She said just two years ago Rangpur was known as 'Monga area'. "In the last two years we said goodbye to Monga from this area. Several projects are being implemented in this area to create employment, such as the VGD

and VGE"

After her speech, the PM invited two soldiers to speak to them. Speaking on the occasion, the soldiers demanded enhanced risk allowance after improving the economic strength of the country.

Hasina agreed on the enhanced rationing for the infants of the soldiers, and said the government would provide enhanced risk allowance after improving the economic strength of the country.

**Dhaka needs \$10b for adaptation**

Bangladesh needs US \$10 billion for mitigation and adaptation to climate changes in the next five to 10 years, said Qazi Kholiquzzaman Ahmad, co-ordinator of the National Climate Change Negotiation Committee, yesterday.

Government needs six more months to complete sector-wise assessment to know the amount required, he said.

He was presenting a keynote paper at a seminar titled 'The outcome of Cancun Climate Change Conference (COP-16) and Bangladesh', organised by Bangladesh Economic Association (BEA) at its office in the city.

BEA President Prof Abul Barkat chaired the seminar.

**BDR mutiny: 2 witnesses testify against 49 accused**

**Agriculture of haor areas needs reform**

**Speakers tell discussion**

A holistic reform of agriculture in haor areas is needed to ensure food security and build a hunger-free country, said speakers at a discussion yesterday.

Pointing towards lack of research and development initiatives there, they said haor areas are full of natural resources but those remain seriously neglected, says a press release.

The discussion was organised by some non-government organisations including Nagorik Shanghati, CSRL and IDEA at Dhaka Reporters Unity in the city.

Haor areas present in some eastern and

northeastern districts including Kishoreganj, Netrokona and Sunamganj, have large farmlands but remain flooded most of the year.

Pointing towards natural calamities there, speakers said farmers could not harvest crops for various natural disasters in five out of ten years.

Sunamganj-4 lawmaker Matiur Rahman, Netrokona-4 lawmaker Rokeya Momin, former National Press Club president Hasan Shahriar, agriculturist Dr M Gul Hossain and Prof Ashrafuzzaman Selim of Bangladesh Agriculture University also spoke at the discussion.
