Big two parties face 'rebels' in most Sylhet divn towns

Voters of 16 municipalities in four districts of Sylhet division will elect their representatives in the local body polls scheduled for January 18.

As many as 74 candidates are contesting for mayoral posts in the 16 municipalities.

In most cases, more than one candidate both from the Awami League led alliance and the BNP led alliance are contesting for the mayoral post.

In Sylhet district, election will be held in two municipalities.

In Zakiganj, contestants for the mayoral post are incumbent Mayor Iqbal Ahmed, also chief of a faction of local BNP, upazila AL President Anwar Hossain, municipality AL General Secretary MA Hafiz, municipality BNP chief Badrul Haque Badal and former UP Chairman Abdul Khalique. Thirty-seven people are on the race for councillorship.

In Kanaighat municipality, upazila AL President Lutfur Rahman, BNP General Secretary Abdul Matin, Bhanulal Dass (AL), Abdul Malik (BNP), Md Oliullah (Jamaat), Suhel Amin (Jatiya Party-JP) and businessman Tajuddin are in the mayoral race.

Four municipalities in Sunamganj district will see election on January 18.

In Sunamganj municipality, AL leader Ayub Bakht Zaglu is contesting Saleha Begum of JP and Shergul Ahmed for the mayorship while 68 others are in fight for councillor posts.

Mayoral candidates in different municipalities in Rangpur division have brought allegation of violation of electoral code of con-

In Sunderganj municipality, grand alliance candidate Abdul Mozid Mondol made a showdown with about 300 supporters on Thursday.

Nurunnabi Saju, immediate past mayor of the municipality formally lodged this complaint with the office of returning officer. Eyewitnesses said, when the procession

in favour of Mozid reached Hablu point, police intercepted the supporters and dispersed them. Contacted, Abdul Mozid, however,

denied the allegation of any showdown in favour of him in the town. Returning officer of Sunderganj munici-

pality election Shamsul Azam told this correspondent that he would take action against the candidate in this connection after investigation. In Lalmonirhat municipality, a woman

councillor candidate was fined Tk1,000 for violating electoral code of conduct on Saturday night. According to the district election officer, a

woman candidate with about 50 supporters was campaigning on Saturday night. Therefore, the returning officer fined her Tk1,000.

The election officer, however, refused to disclose the name of the councillor candidate. were trying to influence by giving cash."

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Meanwhile, grand alliance mayor candidate in Lalmonirhat municipality Reazul Islam Rintu formally lodged a complaint with returning officer saying that former mayor Mosharraf Hossain Rana is giving cash and kinds among the voters at night to bag votes in favour of him.

Rintu also alleged that former deputy minister Asadul Habib Dulu is giving cash to voters in favour of BNP candidate Hafizar Rahman Babla.

Contacted, Rintu said he lodged the complaint against Rana and Babla but RO did not take any action against them till the date.

The returning officer of Lalmonirhat municipality election admitted that he received the complaint and said he engaged law enforcing agencies to investigate if Rana is really using cash and kinds to influence voters.

In Kurigram, president of Awami League (AL) in Kurigram municipality unit Abdul Jalil, also mayor candidate, alleged that mayor candidates- Kaziul Islam and Abu Bakar Siddique are bribing the voters.

Returning Officer of Kurigram municipality said he was not aware of any such allegation. He said, "We have requested Abdul Jalil to show a voter whom Kaziul and Abu Bakar Siddique

BNP, AL expel 'rebel' mayor candidates

Ruling Awami League (AL) and Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) have expelled five 'rebel' mayor candidates in Rangpur division and Jhenidah.

BNP expelled three mayor candidates while AL one in Rangpur division for their candidature in violation of party decision, reports our Rangpur correspondent.

The expelled BNP leaders include organising secretary of BNP of Kurigram district unit Nurul Islam Nuru, BNP secretary of Patgram municipality unit in Lalmonirhat district Morshed Alam Shyamol and BNP president of Lalmonirhat municipality Mosarraf Hossain Rana.

Secretary of BNP Kurigram district unit Saifur Rahman said Nurul Islam did not follow the party instruction to withdraw his candidature and work for



BNP vice president of the district unit Abu Bakor.

In Lalmonirhat, mayor candidate Mosarraf Hossain Rana said he was expelled from the party before election as he did not comply with the request of former deputy minister and president of BNP of the district

unit Asadul Habib Dulu. Asadul Habib Dulu said Rana is no more in the party now. It was district and municipality units' unanimous decision that Hafizar Rahman Babla would be the candidate in Lalmonirhat municipality election, he said.

In Thakurgaon, AL expelled general secretary of Jubo League of Ranishangkoil upazila Alamgir Sarker as he is contesting election instead of backing grand alliance candidate Jatiya Party leader Md. Tohaviolating party decision.

BNP expelled a mayor candidate in Jhenidah as she is campaigning in her electoral area under Kaliganj municipality violating party decision, reports our correspondent.

Kaliganj BNP president and municipal mayor Mahbubar Rahman announced her expulsion at a meeting of BNP activists and leaders on Thursday. BNP president Mahbubar

Rahman said Ashrafuzzaman Lal was nominated by the party. Despite several warning Shahanaz Parveen is carrying on election campaign as mayor candidate compelling the party to expel her.

Shahanaz Parveen said she will continue the election campaign as she is the appropriate candidate and her grandfather is the founder of BNP in Kaliganj upazila.

The municipal mayor has nominated a person with criminal charges, she said.

Khulna: BNP demands army in Chalna, Paikgachha

BNP Khulna district unit yesterday demanded deployment of army in Chalna and Paikgachha for holding free, fair and peaceful elections to the municipalities scheduled for January 13, reports our staff correspondent.

Prof Majidul Islam, president of the unit, made the demand at a press conference at the party office here in the morning. "We want army deployment at Chalna and

Prof Majidul alleged that lawmakers, upazila chairmen and local leaders of the ruling party are violating code of conduct in presence of judicial magistrates and law enforcers while campaigning in favour of their candidates in the two municipalities.

Besides, bribing of voters and damaging of posters of BNP candidates by the ruling party men, free movement of outlaws and the role being played by police in dealing with such unwanted polls-related situation have already put a fair election to the two municipalities on a big question mark, he said.

He further alleged that the ruling party musclemen have threatened to evict about 300 families from their makeshifts houses erected on land owned by Wapda at Chalna if they do not vote for the ALnominated candidates.

BNP has fielded single candidate to vie for the post of mayor both in Paikgachha and Chalna municipalities while the candidates nominated by grand alliance are facing rebel candidates in the race.

Rajbari: HC restores candidacy of Razaul Hasan of BNP

The High Court on Sunday restored the candidacy of a mayoral candidate of Goalunda municipality, reports UNB.

The court passed the order following a writ petition filed by BNP candidate Razaul Hasan Idris. He filed the writ challenging rejection of his nomination paper by the returning officer during scrutiny on December 30 on charge of being a loan defaulter.

The HC sent an order to the deputy commissioner of Rajbari, district election officer and assistant returning officer to include Idris as a mayoral candidate.
