## Tk 135 cr more for security

The government is going to spend a lot on purchasing modern security equipment ahead of the ICC Cricket World Cup 2011.

Iqbal Khan Chowdhury, the convenor of the World Cup 2011 Security and an additional secretary at the Ministry of Home Affairs, told The Daily Star yesterday that the committee would shortly finalise the Contingency Plan which would be approved by the national security committee headed by the home minister by this week.

At least Tk 135 crore will be spent to purchase security equipment and intelligence tools such as bomb disposal equipment, wireless communication system, mobile X-ray machines, bomb and mine detectors, bomb recovering uniform and vehicles to carry off bombs, night-glasses, binoculars, mobile tracker and luggage and vehicle scanners, walkie-talkie sets, video cameras and CCTVs.

# Mashrafe jogging, but might miss WC cut

Three weeks after Mashrafe bin Mortaza picked up a seemingly ICC Cricket World Cup World Cup ending knee 2011 injury, the paceman from

Narail started light jogging and batting without any pain yesterday. But despite the encouraging prognosis, there is hardly any chance for the former Bangladesh captain to receive the fitness clearance before the 15member team announcement for the ICCWorld Cup.

The Rafiqul Islam-led selection panel is likely to submit the 15member team from the short-listed 23member squad on January 16, as all 14 teams participating in the tournament have to announce their final fifteen before January 19 this year.

The obvious question during Wednesday's practice at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur was whether the Narail Express would be available for selection but national team physio Michael Henry ruled out any chances whatsoever.

"No, he won't. No chance," responded Henry when he was asked whether Mashrafe would be fit before the final team announcement.

"He (Mashrafe) ran for the first time today, since he got injured. He did some light jogging and he also batted. But we are focusing on making sure there's no repercussion and we are pushing his rehab. Of course, we will try to hold off till the last minute," he added.

Henry was not ready to give any timeline about when Mashrafe will be able to start bowling.

"There's a timeline but that's up to Mashrafe. We are not putting any external pressure. We will try to make it a clinical decision rather than one based on a timeline," Henry explained.

Mashrafe, who sustained his latest knee injury on December 21 last year during a Premier Division Cricket League match at BKSP, however said that he would start bowling within two weeks.

"I started running today and also batted without any pain. Our physio has not told me when I will be able to start bowling but I hope that within two weeks time I can start bowling," said Mashrafe, who had earlier expressed his determination to play the World **♦**Cup at home.

Debutant Chris Woakes guided England to a record eighth successive Twenty20 international win as the tourists inflicted more torment on Australia with a last-gasp onewicket victory at the Adelaide Oval on Wednesday.

Despite all-rounder Shane Watson's best efforts to single-handedly lift the home side to victory, 21-year-old Woakes (19 not out) was the hero as he hit the winning run from the final ball of the England innings.

After Australia posted 157-4, with Watson top-scoring with 59 from 31 balls, England wobbled in the chase as Watson picked up four wickets, but Woakes' cool head enabled

them to reach 158-9 and snatch the win. England previously shared the record for

most successive T20 international wins with South Africa and Pakistan and the result follows hard on the heels of their historic 3-1 Ashes triumph over the embattled Australians.


Even so it was a challenging total on an outfield slower than usual because of rain in the days leading up to the match.
