Pakistan keep Afridi as ODI captain

Pakistani selectors on Wednesday retained Shahid Afridi as captain for the upcoming one-day series against New Zealand, boosting his chances of leading the side in next month's World Cup.

The selection committee kept Afridi on as captain in the finalised the 16-man squad, a Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) release said.

Local media reports had said PCB chairman Ijaz Butt was ready to strip Afridi off the captaincy, angry at comments made by the all-rounder about three Pakistani cricketers at the centre of a spotfixing scandal.

But the 30-year-old Afridi kept the role despite losing the Twenty20 series against New Zealand last month. Misbahul Haq, who led

Pakistan in the two-Test series against New Zealand, will be Afridi's deputy. Veteran batsman Moha-

mmad Yousuf was left out, raising fears the 36-year-old will not make the final World Cup squad.

Wicketkeeper Kamran Akmal, who was cleared by the PCB for selection after he too fell under the spotlight of the investigation into spot-fixing, was restored to the side for the New Zealand series.

Delay disappoints all

Former Pakistan players and fans on Tuesday expressed their disappointment after an anti-corruption tribunal against three cricketers ended in Doha without a decision.

The tribunal hearing allegations against Salman Butt, Mohammad Asif and Mohammad Aamer decided to continue its deliberations and hold a further hearing in Doha on February 5.

The trio face charges of spot-fixing during Pakistan's tour of England last year in a scandal that rocked the sport. It is alleged that they conspired in the bowling of deliberate no-balls -- claims they all deny.

Pakistani media reported on Tuesday that Aamer's lawyer, Shahid Karim, had asked the tribunal headed by Michael Beloff to defer announcing its verdict.

Former Pakistan captain Zaheer Abbas criticised the delay in the decision.

"It's absurd," Abbas told AFP. "The International Cricket Council (ICC) has kept the players hostage for the last five months

and now they have deferred the decision, which is inexplicable."

Abbas said the three key players cannot participate in the World Cup, to be jointly hosted by India, Sri Lanka and Bangladesh from February 19 to April 2.

All 14 competing countries have to announce their final 15-man squad by January 19.

"Because the players will continue to remain suspended they cannot play at any level, cannot practice so they are virtually out of the World Cup," said Abbas.

Another former captain Asif Iqbal was also surprised at the delay.

"The ICC has taken so much time on this case and have spent so much money on it and yet could not take a decision... it is strange," said Iqbal.

"I am surprised at the delay."

Former spin bowler Iqbal Qasim, however, backed the decision.

"Since it is a high-profile case, so any judgement needed to be properly gauged and legal opinion is also required and that's why they have delayed the decision," said Qasim.

Fans also criticised the delay.

The Belgian world number three reaffirmed her status as favourite for next week's Australian Open with five service breaks on the way to a 6-3, 6-2 win over the seventhseeded Azarenka in 85 minutes.

Clijsters will face the winner of unseeded pair, Dominika Cibulkova of Slovakia and Russia's Alisa Kleybanova in Thursday's semifinals. China's Li Na will take on Serbian quali-

fier Bojana Jovanovski in the other semi, after Jovanovski beat Flavia Pennetta 6-4, 6-1 in their quarterfinal. With no Serena Williams in Melbourne and

the patchy early season form of the two topranked women, Caroline Wozniacki and Vera Zvonareva, Clijsters was in devastating form.

The Belgian mother controlled the match

from the baseline in swirling winds with her deep groundstrokes putting Azarenka on the defensive.

Clijsters raced to a 5-1 lead before briefly allowing Azarenka back into the set, then closed out the second set with two breaks. Li was the first player into the semifinals

after a gruelling dogfight with Russia's Svetlana Kuznetsova. The 11th-ranked Li wore down the twotime Grand Slam champion, 3-6, 7-6 (7/4), 6-

3 in almost two and a half hours on a warm day to book her spot in the last four of the tournament. Li will be bidding to go one better in

Sydney than her losing semifinal appearance to Clijsters in the 2007 tournament. Li, who became the first Chinese player to

break into the world top 10 rankings after reaching the semifinals of last year's Australian Open, was pleased to have got past Kuznetsova.

It was Li's fourth win against the former French and US Open champion in their 11 meetings. "It was a tough match because the condi-

tions were hot today," Li said.
