### WARRIORS MUNICIPAL POLLS AL favourites

Awami League-backed candidates fought back in the battle of ballots by winning the majority of municipal mayoral posts in Barisal and Khulna divisions yester-

day, a day after suffering setback in the divisions of Rajshahi and Rangpur. In the divisions' 49 municipalities, AL-supported

favourites bagged 14. Dissidents from AL got seven seats while BNP's rebels won three. Three independent contestants also emerged


victorious. In 19 municipalities of Barisal, only one BNP favourite scored a win.

Meanwhile, the ruling Awami League took a hardline about the dissidents who ran without the party backing and are blamed by its top brass for Wednesday's down-

AL President Sheikh Hasina last night directed her party colleagues to expel the rebel candidates, two senior leaders told The Daily Star.

The rebels, who even won in the south, are likely to face the same action.

# No wrong in detention

US ambassador-at-large for war crimes says pre-charge detention no violation of int'l standards

Accused war criminals can be detained before bringing charges against them as long as their prolonged detention is judicially reviewed, Stephen J Rapp, US ambassador-at-large for war crimes issues, has said.

"Different countries follow different process and different courts have different procedures," he said

yesterday, adding, "Pre-charging detention is not automatically a violation of international standards." Speaking at a press conference at American

Recreation Association in the capital, he stressed that accused should be tried for their activities, and not for their association with any organisation.

"Individuals are judged not by what association they are part of but what they did. Even then one's membership is not enough to convict an individual, it has to be on SEE PAGE 7 COL 1
