3 Dhaka-Delhi deals come into effect

Sub-inspector Babul Hossain of Badda Police Station quoted the said the caretaker of the building as saying the body was laid in a room of the house with the door ajar.


Janitor Nazrul Islam said four youths rented a room in the house on January 1. They have been absconding since the incident, he added.
