Taliban to allow girls' education

Says Pak education minister

The Taliban are ready to drop their ban on schooling girls in Afghanistan, the country's education minister has said yesterday.

Farooq Wardak told the UK's Times Educational Supplement a "cultural change" meant the Taliban were "no more opposing girls' education".

The Taliban - who are fighting the Kabul government - have made no public comment on the issue.

Afghan women were not allowed to work or get an education under the Taliban regime overthrown in 2001.

Mr Wardak made his comments during the Education World Forum in London.

He told the TES: "What I am hearing at the very upper policy level of the Taliban is that they are no more opposing education and also girls' education.

"I hope, Inshallah (God willing), soon there will be a peaceful negotiation, a meaningful negotiation with our own opposition and that will not compromise at all the basic human rights and basic principles which have been guiding us to provide quality and balanced education to our people," the minister added.

Across the country agreements have been struck at a local level between militants and village elders to allow girls and female teachers to return to schools, the BBC's Quentin Sommerville in Kabul reports.

Mr Wardak's words suggest the negotiations have gone beyond issues like the release of prisoners to touch on areas of government policy, correspondents say.

However, the education minister admitted historical opposition to schooling extended beyond the Taliban to the "deepest pockets" of Afghan society.

EU gives two mln euros in aid for Sri Lanka floods

The European Commission decided yesterday to release two million euros in emergency humanitarian aid for the victims of devastating floods in Sri Lanka.

The assistance will be distributed through international aid agencies to provide emergency food aid, water and sanitation, and emergency relief items.

"I feel that it is the EU's duty to make it possible for thousands of people to receive emergency relief,' said European aid commissioner Kristalina Georgieva.

The number of people killed in Sri Lanka's monsoon flooding and mudslides has risen to 27 with more than a million still displaced by the devastating disaster.

Myanmar planning large-scale privatisation

Myanmar could undergo a major economic upheaval following controversial elections last month, as local media reported the country plans to privatise the majority of state-owned industries.

Deputy minister of industry Khin Maung Kyaw was quoted in Biweekly Eleven journal as saying reform in Myanmar, which is about to form parliaments after its first poll in 20 years, was in line with "other democratic countries".

"While we transform as a democratic nation, we will privatise 90 percent of stateowned industrial businesses," he said.

India to cut Kashmir forces by 25pc

India plans to reduce its security forces by a quarter in the Himalayan region of Kashmir to ease conditions for people in one of the world's most militarised areas, a top official said yesterday.

The unexpected announcement on Kashmir by Home Secretary G.K. Pillai is intended to rebuild fractured public goodwill after a violent uprising by young people in the Muslim-majority region last year.

New Delhi faced one of the biggest challenges to its grip on the divided and disputed territory last summer when more than 100 people were shot dead by security forces during violent demonstrations.

Speaking at a university seminar on Kashmir in the Indian capital, Pillai said the aim was "to pull out 25 percent of troops from populated areas in the next 12 months as a confidence-building measure."

The presence of hundreds of thousands of paramilitary and army troops in Kashmir -- India does not disclose official troop figures -is seen by local politicians and observers as fuelling anger against rule from New Delhi.

Deaths due to the violence are at their lowest level in more than a decade.

Hardline Kashmiri separatist leader Syed Ali Shah Geelani rejected the government's plan and demanded the full withdrawal of Indian forces from the region.

Residents of Kashmir who spoke to AFP in the main city Srinagar had a mixed response to the withdrawal plan.

Farooq Ahmed Butt, a schoolteacher,

said: "This is a positive step as it will pave way in building a conducive atmosphere for resolution of the Kashmir issue." The majority of militant groups active in

the Indian-administered part of the region favour its secession from India to neighbouring Pakistan.

In December 2009, the Indian army said it had pulled out 30,000 troops from Kashmir, one of the biggest military drawdowns in a decade.

Five killed in Pak-Afghan border shelling

Five civilians were killed and six wounded when mortar shells fired from Afghanistan hit a border village in northwest Pakistan's rugged tribal region, military officials said yesterday.

"Five mortar shells fired from the Afghan side landed in Teti Madakhel village," in the Mir Ali district of North Waziristan region late Thursday, a military official said.

He said the mortars hit houses located just three kilometres from the border.

"As a result, five civilians - three women and two men -- were killed and six injured," he said.

Intelligence officials confirmed the mortar attack.

Sri Lanka Floods Rains cause havoc

Fresh rains yesterday compounded the misery of the million-plus victims of Sri Lanka's deadly floods, as relief workers struggled to bring crucial supplies to the worst-affected regions. After a brief respite overnight, renewed downpours bat-

tered the island's central and eastern districts where 27 people have been killed by the flood waters and mudslides. "The situation is clearly worsening," said Paula Alvarado,

a regional spokesman for the International Federation of the Red Cross.

"Landslides continue to occur in the hilly provinces and many dams are threatening to burst. We already have over one million people affected and that number is likely to increase quickly," Alvarado said. Some 3,000 soldiers have been deployed to help with the

relief efforts, along with trucks and air force helicopters, as UN convoys have battled to bring supplies in by road. A large number of those forced out of their homes had

only recently been resettled after decades of ethnic conflict between Tamil Tiger rebels and government forces. And many had also seen their livelihoods wrecked before

by the December 2004 Asian tsunami.

"Many families were just returning home after years of displacement," said Reza Hossaini, country representative for the UN children's agency, UNICEF.

"They were rebuilding their lives, children were returning to their community schools, and now they all face this latest severe setback," Hossaini said.

WikiLeaks gives \$15,000 to soldier's defense fund

A legal defense fund for the US soldier suspected of leaking secret US documents to WikiLeaks said Thursday it has received a 15,000 dollars contribution from the website.

US Army private Bradley Manning, 23, has been held in a military brig in Virginia since July on suspicion of leaking secret US military documents and State Department cables toWikiLeaks.

WikiLeaks has repeatedly said it does not know whether Manning was the source of the documents but has pledged to help with his defense.

The Bradley Manning Support Network said in a statement on Thursday published at bradleymanning.org that WikiLeaks had transferred 15,100 dollars on Monday to the legal trust account of Manning's attorney.

"This donation from WikiLeaks is vital to our efforts to ensure Bradley receives a fair, open trial," said Support Fund founder and steering committee member Mike Gogulski.

The group said the WikiLeaks contribution brings the total funds raised and transferred to Bradley's civilian legal defence team to over 100,000 dollars, just short of the

115,000 dollars needed "to mount a vigorous defence." Manning, who worked as a low-ranking army intelligence analyst in Iraq, was arrested in May and later transferred to the US Marine Corps base at Quantico in Virginia.
