Army deployment the last resort, says CEC

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) ATM Shamsul Huda yesterday reiterated his position against deployment of army during any local government polls.

Huda told a meeting that he is displeased as Election Commission (EC) decided to deploy army in municipal polls this time. "We don't want army in the election.

It's our last resort. We should not call in army without any proper reason."

He said army should not be thought of as an alternative to police and administration. It will not benefit the nation in the long run, he added.

Huda stressed the culture of army deployment during elections must end; rather administration and police should have the capacity to conduct a poll.
