

I am delighted that our vision of human resources development of Bangladesh have been realized through institutionalization of IUBAT—International University of Business Agriculture and Technology since 1991. IUBAT has passed through its 19 years up the scale and at this auspicious occasion of 19th Foundation Anniversary Fortnight Celebration I am privileged to offer my felicitations to the faculty, staff and students who have been taking a large share in translating IUBAT's mission into reality.

While I cast my look into the history of IUBAT, the path was not that much easy. I initiated the concept of establishing Non-government Universities in Bangladesh in early 1989 in collaboration with the Kansas State University, USA, Asian Institute of Technology and Assumption University in Thailand. It took me a lot of energy to convince policy makers of the country for institutionalizing non-government universities in Bangladesh, while others also contributed to the process.

Non-government universities are contributing substantially to the development of higher education in the country. However, mere establishment of non-government universities cannot address the question of access to higher education in an impoverished society like Bangladesh. The issue of access is to be addressed by creating financing arrangements. This led me to develop the concept of Knowledge Based Area Development (KBAD): A Step Towards Community Self-Reliance. Under KBAD, IUBAT is making higher education inclusive allowing access to all applicants who meet the academic criteria regardless of the financial standing of the family. The dream of IUBAT is to produce at least one professional graduate from each village of the country for social mobility and prosperity.

Presently, the university is providing quality higher education to about 5000 students from home and abroad in masters, bachelors and diploma programs in its own campus of 5.5 acres of land surrounded with greeneries that

gives the campus a reflection of an environment designed for learning. The university nurtures an international network that involves formal agreements with as many as 64 institutions of higher learning in the 4 continents, membership in academic bodies, and professional associations. Inputs from the International Advisory Council, linkage with collaborating universities and visiting professors, fellows and researchers as well commitment of professional faculty and staff members of the university enrich the
