

To observe the 3rd death anniversary of Natyacharya Selim Al Deen, a three-day theatre festival has begun at Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA) from January 14. Named after the late theatre icon, the festival has been organised by his troupe Dhaka Theatre, in association with Jahangirnagar University and BSA. The festival that ends today features seven Al Deen plays.

On the inaugural day, Dhaka Theatre and Pantomime Movement, Chittagong staged two plays, "Dhaboman" and "Prachya" respectively. Rizwan Rajon was the director of the mimodrama. Rajon also played the role of Sayfarchan. Among others, Liza, Ishita, Shobhon, Shaon, Iftekhar, Rubel and Murad performed in the play.

Today, Department of Drama and Dramatics, JU and Shilpakala Academy will stage "Keramat Mangal" and "Putra" at the Experimental Theatre Hall and Studio Theatre Hall respectively.

Selim Al Deen passed away on January 14, 2008 after a cardiac arrest. He was the playwright of most of Dhaka Theatre plays.


