After ex-England coach Steve McClaren sold striker Edin Dzeko to Manchester City over the German league's winter break, Wolfsburg lacked firepower up front against Bayern, but showed dogged domination against the champions.

Bayern's Dutch star Arjen Robben conceded Dortmund may now be too far ahead for Munich, who are 16 points off the pace, to retain their title.

"There's no point talking about first place any more, as several of us have already said," admitted Robben after making his first appearance of the season.

"Obviously, there's always hope while it's still theoretically possible, but we're just too far behind.

"You have to accept and also respect that. It's simply a superb achievement by Dortmund, you can already congratulate them on winning the title. Dortmund are simply too far ahead."

Bayern opened the scoring when Thomas Mueller went one-to-one with goalkeeper Deigo Benaglio for a loose

ball, 20 metres out, and the ball bounced off the Munich man's legs and into the empty net early on.

Philipp Lahm then saw his penalty attempt slam off the post after he beat Benaglio following a foul on Bayern's Danijel Pranjic by Ashkan Dejagah on 21 minutes. There was bad news for



#### **Ribery relieved**

Bayern Munich midfielder Franck Ribery admitted Sunday he was relieved his knee injury is only expected to keep him out of training for five days.

### Lofthouse passes away

Former England international Nat Lofthouse has died aged 85, his old club Bolton announced on their website Sunday.

Lofthouse, who scored 30 goals in his 33 appearances for England, died peacefully in his sleep at a nursing home in Bolton, northwest England, on Saturday night, the statement said. Lofthouse - who earned the nickname 'Lion of

Vienna' for his performance in England's 3-2 win over Austria in 1952 - made more than 450 appearances for the Trotters, scoring 285 goals for the club between 1946 and 1960, and four years ago was voted Bolton's greatest ever player. Lofthouse, who was footballer of the year in 1953,

captained Bolton in two FA Cup finals - both of them memorable for different reasons.

His first was in 1953 which became known as the 'Matthews final' as Sir Stanley Matthews - ably assisted by Stanley Mortensen - inspired Blackpool
