

ILLEGAL HOUSING PROJECTS IN DHAKA

Govt told to act tough

HC directs it to stop advertisement, earth-filling, sale of plots

The High Court yesterday directed the government and other authorities concerned to stop advertisement, earth-filling and sale of plots by unapproved and unauthorised housing projects in and around Dhaka.

The HC bench of Justice AHM

and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain passed the order following a petition filed by Bangladesh Environment Lawyers Association (Bela).

The HC bench asked the government to remove immediately all signboards, billboards and other advertising means containing names or other description of unap-

Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik proved and unauthorised projects.

The court also directed the authorities concerned to ensure that plots of such housing projects are not sold or money is not collected through project offices or other means.


