Tigers' squad on hold

To be disclosed tomorrow after review

The country will have to wait till the last day of deadline to know the Tigers' World Cup squad ICC Cricket World Cup after the Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) decided to

announce the 15-member team on January 19.

After a marathon meeting of the technical and evaluation committee that lasted more than three hours, it was informed that due to 'several scopes of discussion', the team could not be put forward for BCB president's approval. The technical committee, led by Enayet Hossain Siraj, is the first checking point for the selectors, and the Rafiqul Alamled panel failed to get past that hurdle with what mooted to be their choice of 15.

The chief reason behind the delay, according to Siraj, is consideration of medical grounds. In other words, Mashrafe Bin Mortaza's standing in the team, after his fitness report confirmed that he wouldn't be fit before selection, kept the meeting a hotlycontested one.

Sources have confirmed that Mashrafe wasn't in the selection committee's consideration, a reason enough for the some of the technical committee members to oppose. Another area, the team's middle-order, also kept the meeting busy with the position of Rokibul much-talked about.

The debate put the autonomy of the selection committee in serious threat for a second time but Siraj said that since the board takes all the blame, the technical committee is legitimate to discuss anything.

The common practice is for the selectors to select the team and the board president to approve it. It used to be an academic event but the evaluation committee, a latest creation of the board, has put a stop to what used to be a very simple equation. According to a source, Rafiqul Alam and his two colleagues had to face a lot of questions and give a lot of explanations on the choices they made.

"The selectors do pick the team but ultimately, BCB are to blame if something goes wrong. So there is nothing wrong if the technical committee evaluates the selection and

After surviving the first 10 minutes, Arambagh showed signs of life when Sharif Khan whipped in a cross from the right for Liberian striker Benjamin Cooper, who headed the cross narrowly wide in the 20th minute. Sheikh Jamal however, should have taken

'Our worst time'

Hannan Sarkar played the 2003 World Cup. The stylish opener, in a chat to The Daily Star Sport, recalls his memories of the event, and also reveals the solidarity of the Tigers' fans during what was an ill-fated tournament.

Daily Star Sport (DSS): How did it feel when you heard that you would play the 2003 World Cup?

Hannan Sarkar (HS): We toured South Africa in 2002 where we did pretty well and personally I was in good nick. I did well in domestic cricket too, so I was sort of confident that I would get in the side. Nevertheless it was a good

> moment when I heard that I was in the 15-member squad.

DSS: How excited were you? HS: I used to open with Al Shahriar at that time. So, way before the tournament, I was getting excited thinking about striking the first ball for Bangladesh in the World Cup. I was waiting for the moment and finally it came against Canada.


DSS: How was the team atmosphere in South Africa? **HANNAN SARKAR**

HS: Team atmosphere was fine. There were no negatives as such. We were touring Namibia before the start of the world Cup where Gordon Greenidge joined us, and it was a nice gesture to have our former coach

back encouraging us. DSS: Was there frustration with your performance?

HS: Yes, my performance wasn't good in the tournament. I scored only 34 runs from the three matches I played, the highest being 25 against Canada. And from the team's perspective it was the worst tournament for us, I would say, in our cricket history.




