The stockmarket regulator instructed the exchanges to suspend the trading after it predicted that the market would see a massive fall if the transactions continued.

The Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) directive came following the General Index of Dhaka Stock Exchange (DGEN) slumped 237 points and Selective Categories Index of Chittagong Stock Exchange by 298 points.
