

The Santal Resistance earned a significant place in the pages of our history. It was the Santals who confronted the British Raj in 1784. Their attempt to evict colonial rule from the sub-continent paved the way for many forthcoming revolution ary attempts. Santal leaders Shidhu, Kanu, Chand and Bhairab revolted once again in 1855

After the Partition (1947), the Santals supported Ila Mitra to organise the 1950 Nachol Uprising The aim remained unchanged: economic free-In 2000, Santal leader Alfred Soren sacrificed his life to accomplish the same goal left unachieved by his ancestors in the independent and sovereign Bangladesh. Alfred Soren of Bhimpur village, Naogaon, was killed on August


