3 power projects delay for a month

Three large private electricity generation projects awarded to local power company Summit has delayed for a month due to the firm's reservations about possession of land for the schemes.

Summit Industrial and Mercantile Corporation won the power projects with the total capacity of 1,017 megawatt in Bibiyana and Meghnaghat and was expected to initial a set of four agreements for each of these projects last month.

But the land for these projects have not been acquired completely by the govern-

ment and therefore it could not sign any of these agreements on power purchase, land lease, gas purchase and implementation.

The authorities have been urging Summit to sign at least one or two of these agreements as finalisation of any of these agreements actually takes a few months to complete.

Oil spill near coast of Mumbai


