Gas prospects made gloomy

Fingers pointed at tardy Petrobangla

SHARIER KHAN

The country will continue to suffer from gas crisis for the next few years as Petrobangla has failed to increase gas production and its capability to supply gas in line with the rising demand.

The shortfall in gas supply now stands at around 500 million cubic feet a day (mmcfd), sufficient to generate power to meet one third of the country's electricity demand.

Domestic users need 130-140 mmcfd gas in the capital but its supply now hov-

ers around 110 mmcfd, said officials of Titas Gas Transmission and Distribution Company Ltd.

Titas has been trying to improve gas supply by replacing old and narrow gas

It has replaced around 56 kilometres of pipelines in the city. But there will not be any big improvement in supply unless gas production increases, said an official asking not to be named.

"But we don't see any realistic projection of increased gas supply," the official said.

Briton in wheelchair sets out for a 5,000-mile journey to raise fund for CRP

Peter Donnelly, a spirited 24-year-old from St Helens in Liverpool, who is paralysed from the neck down, started rolling back towards his hometown in his wheelchair yesterday.

Donnelly, a volunteer for the Centre for the Rehabilitation of the

Paralysed (CRP), will travel across 14 countries in two continents to raise funds for the organisation.

His 5,000-mile journey began at the National Monument in Savar, where the organisation is headquartered.

Four years ago, just days before his 20th birthday, Donnelly suffered a critical spinal injury in a motorbike accident and lost ability to walk.

Pvt project on public land

Developer gobbled up 202 acres at courtesy of 4-party govt's land ministry

"Deliberate" neglect by the Ministry of Land during the fourparty alliance rule paved way for a developer to take over 202.76 acres of public land.

The land belongs to the Court of Wards that has been custodian of the legendary Bhawal estate since late 1930s.

The East West Property Development Ltd (EWPD) has developed its housing project near Baridhara on that particular piece ofland.

Prompted by repeated reminders from the custodian of the estate since 1993 that its land was being grabbed, the government has recently formed a probe committee to look into the matter.

Earlier in 2008, the then govern- Appellate Board. ment formed another committee to look into the same allegations. The report of that probe, however, never came to light.


