Mild to moderate cold wave is sweeping over Rajshahi, Rangpur and Sylhet divisions and the regions of Mymensingh, Tangail, Madaripur, Sandwip, Sitakunda, Rangamati, Comilla, Satkhira, Jessore, Kushtia and Barisal and it may continue for next 12 hours until 6:00pm today.

Night temperature may rise slightly over the country, Met office said. Weather is likely to remain dry with partly cloudy sky over the country. Moderate to thick fog may occur over the river basins and light to moderate fog may occur elsewhere over the country during midnight till morning.

The sun sets in the capital at 5:38pm today and rises at 6:42am tomorrow. Country's highest temperature 26.4 degrees Celsius was recorded yesterday at Feni and lowest 06.2 degrees Celsius at Srimongal.

Hundreds of winners of the competition started gathering at the venue since afternoon.

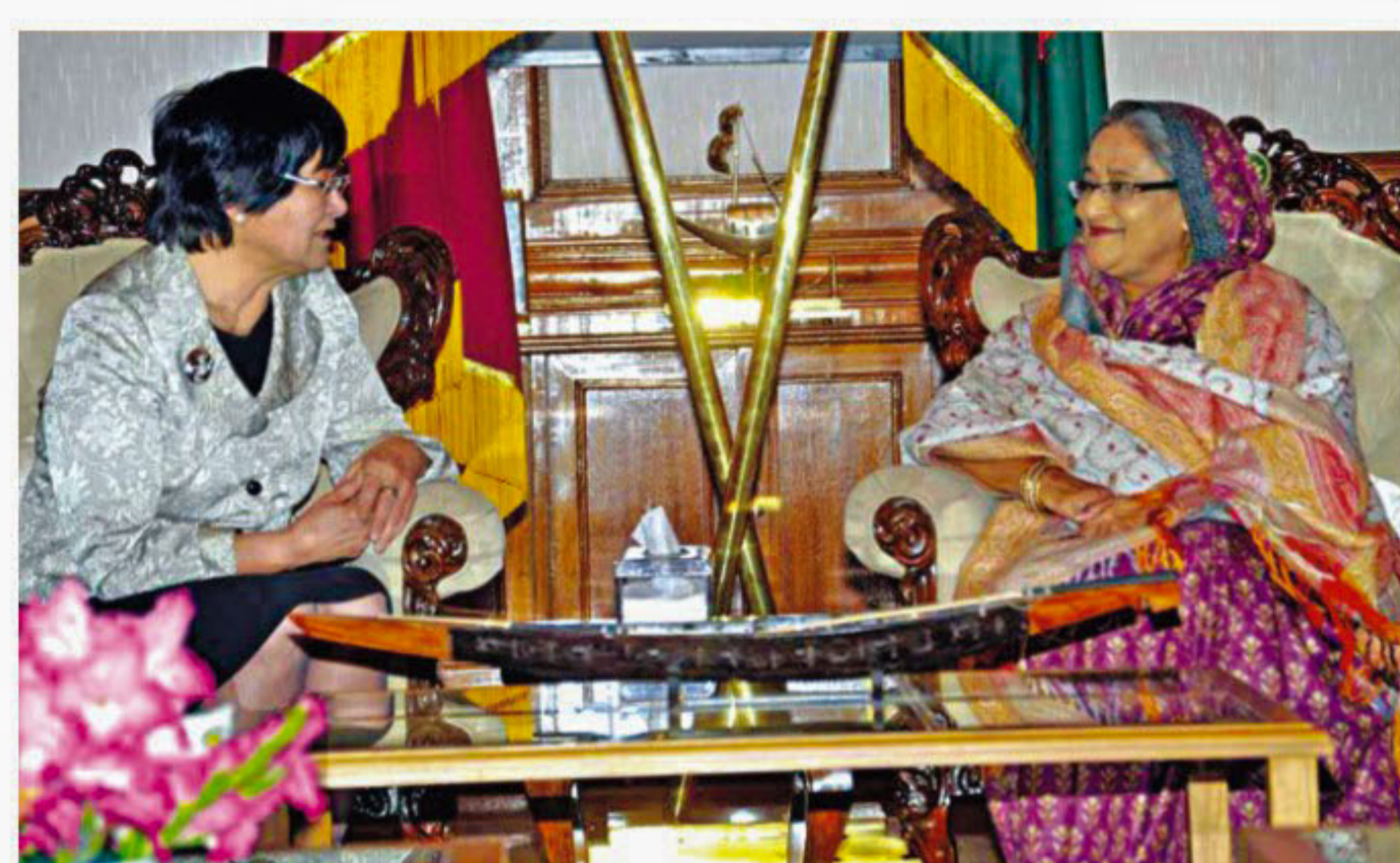
Elated with receiving the prizes, the youngsters chanted "We will read books, we will build enlightened nation."

### Municipal polls were most peaceful in history: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has described the recently held municipal polls as the most peaceful in the history of Bangladesh.

She said the results and environment of the municipal elections substantiated the present government's commitment to ensuring people's right to free, fair, neutral and peaceful vote.

The premier made the remarks when visiting International Cooperation Minister of Canada Beverley J Oda paid a courtesy call on her at Gono Bhaban yesterday evening.

Hasina told the Canadian minister that after taking the office, the present government has made the Election Commission completely independent.

Whenever Awami League took charge of the government it gave its best efforts to establish people's democratic rights, she said. "We always work to establish the power of the people," the premier was quoted as saying by her Deputy Press Secretary Nazrul Islam.

Empowerment of the mass people would ultimately accelerate the national endeavour towards achieving rule of law, good governance, transparency and accountability, observed Hasina.

The Canadian minister praised the visionary leadership of Sheikh Hasina, saying that she has been impressed to see Bangladesh's progress in socio-economic sectors.

She assured Hasina of the Canadian government's continued assistance to Bangladesh in all development sectors especially child and maternal healthcare.

Thanking the Canadian government for its cooperation, the prime minister discussed with Oda the present government's various programmes to ensure quality healthcare facilities for every citizen and achieve universal food security.

On the impact of climate change, Hasina said the government is implementing a 134-point action plan to save the people from the disastrous impacts of global warming.

Besides, she said green belts are being created in the coastal areas of the country.

PM's Adviser Gowhar Rizvi, Ambassador at-Large M Ziauddin and Canadian High Commissioner in Dhaka Robert McDougall were present.

### 10 fibre-reinforced plastic boats for 50 fishermen in Savar

Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) yesterday in Savar handed over 10 boats, made of fibre-reinforced plastic, to 50 fishermen, one for five men, of the southwestern districts.

FAO delivered the boats as a part of its project -- 'Support to Assist Landless, Marginal and Small Farmers to Overcome Soaring Input and Food Prices in Impoverished Areas of Bangladesh', with the financial support of European Union Food Facility Fund.

Fisherman Yousuf Hawladar of Mehendiganj in Barisal, in his reaction, said he would not need to share his catch with the 'mohajons' (money lenders) as he could now sail his own boat.

The boats come with a 16 horse-powered engine, three fuel tanks, two life buoys, two anchors, two rudders, a compass, a radio receiver, a torch, sailcloth and a set of navigation bulbs.

El Zein El Muzamil, FAO senior emergency coordinator, said, "Unbreakable and unsinkable, the boats will last 25 years if properly maintained."

Department of Fisheries Director General Mahbubur Rahman Khan, FAO Representative Ad Spijkers and EU in Bangladesh Section Chief Koen Duchateau were present at the programme.
