IMAM MURDER

Three arrested

Detective Branch (DB) police early yesterday arrested three people in connection with the murder of head imam Hafez Mohammad Ishaque of Police Officers' Quarter Jame Mosque.

Ishaque's shackle tied decomposed body was found in an apartment at Shewrapara in the city on January 1.

DB arrested Bayejit Kazi, 42, from Gopinathpur in Kazipara of Gopalganj district; Nazim Uddin, 40, from city's Nayapaltan area; and Uzzal, 21, from Noorer chala of city's Badda area and produced them at a press briefing yesterday.

DB claimed that Ishaque had a feud with his cousin Haji Abdur Rahim while acting as an arbiter to dissolve a problem between Rahim and another cousin Ilias over the ownership of a salt processing factory two years back.

Rahim, an expatriate of Malaysia, masterminded the killing and hired professional killers for the job, DB claimed.

Police claimed that all arrestees were professionals and they confessed to commit the murder during primary interrogation.

Senior Assistant Commissioner of DB Mohammad Shahidullah, after the press briefing, told The Daily Star that on December 20, Bayzid brought Ishaque to the house, which he rented on December 6 for the murder, to perform milad. Ishaque's brother Mohammad Shuaib told the correspondent that Rahim bought the factory at Potia of Chittagong from Ilias for Tk 1 crore 35 lakh three years ago.

TITAS GAS FIELD

Govt will survey to find out cause of leakage

Petrobangla will soon start a survey in Titas gas field to figure out the prime cause of gas seepage from the country's largest gas field, says an official.

"We are engaging international consultant to identify the root cause of the seepage of Titas," said Petrobangla Chairman Hossain Monsur.

"We are also trying to engage our local consultants here." The government allocated about Tk 10 crore for this survey, he added.

According to local experts, Titas gas field started facing serious trouble in 2005, but the authority has taken any adequate action as yet.

In 2008, Bangladesh Gas Field Company Ltd (BGFCL) completed a \$10.2m project for sealing the troubled well (No 3) to stop gas leakage.

But it was partially successful to 'kill' well No 3 to save the precious substance from

going up into the air every day.

Titas has 16 wells with 14 currently in operation. Well No 3 was killed in January 2008 and production has been suspended at well No 14 for water onrush.

Geologists assume that Titas field loses one to five million cubic feet gas every day since start of the leakage. The field supplied 4 trillion cubic feet gas in last 40 years.

The authorities did not take any effective measure to stop the leakage, they observed. The gas from the field still accounts for about 22 per cent of national production.

The non-stop leakage of gas from Titas field has been continuing unabated for the last five years. All efforts to contain it have gone in vain. According to BGFCL, gas was leaking

through more than 3,000 big holes, including ones with some 30-foot diameter. The gas was spreading to paddy fields,

water bodies, and the Titas river. Gas being spewed through some holes is burning with leaping flames.

Students ransack buses

Five bus passengers were injured, one of them critically, as some students vandalised several vehicles following a dispute with transport workers at the city's Banani yesterday.

Mohammad Sumon, 21, was admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with critical head injury. Police picked up three transport workers after the incident.

Gulshan police said some transport workers assaulted a private university student following an argument over boarding a bus of Dhaka Paribahan around 12:45pm.

Shortly afterwards, 60 to 70 fellow students swooped on the buses at Kakoli intersection with sticks and bricks, vandalising at least eight vehicles.

Mohammad Adnan, a student of BAF Shaheen College, got the injured to DMCH but did not disclose the university's name.
