At least 32 houses and valuables worth around Tk 35 lakh were gutted in two fire incidents here yesterday.

In an incident at Kamil Chowdhury's house in Nodimpur union of Raozan, 16 semi pucca houses and valuables worth around Tk 30 lakh were gutted around 3:30am. Fire station sources said the fire originated from an electric short circuit.

Another fire at Yasinpara of North Podua of Lohagara gutted at least 16 semi pucca houses and valuables worth around Tk 5 lakh. The fire originated from a kitchen around 12:10am.

UZ chairmen's hunger strike called off

Upazila chairmen and vicechairmen yesterday agreed to postpone their hunger strike till March 28 after some leaders of the grand alliance assured them they would discuss the issue in parliament.

Workers Party of Bangladesh President Rashed Khan Menon, Jatiya Party Chairman HM Ershad and Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal President Hasanul Haque Inu visited the programme venue and assured them of placing their demands in the parliament's fresh session scheduled to start tomorrow.

The leaders also promised to talk to the prime minister regarding their demands, said Abdul Mazid Photo, president of the Bangladesh Upazila Parishad Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen Oikya Parishad.

"We have postponed our hunger strike till March 28 after receiving their assurance but we will launch a tougher programme, if our demands are not fulfilled," he said.

Appointed by President Obama in May 2009, CdeBaca formerly served in the US Justice Department.


City Projonmo League leader shot

ROAD NEAR MAHASTANGARH SITE

HC summons two Bogra AL men

The High Court (HC) yesterday summoned two Awami League leaders and three others on charges of constructing a road near Mahasthangarh archaeological site in Bogra ignoring an HC order. An HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury

Manik and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain directed them to appear before the court on January 30 for their statements in connection with the construction work. The summoned persons are Bogra AL leaders Khokon

Sarker and Sabuj Sarker, officer-in-charge of the police station concerned, curator and president of Mahasthangarh Mazar Unnayan Committee. The court passed the order following a supplementary

petition filed by Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh (HRPB). According to the petition, the two AL leaders are report-

edly constructing a road near Mahasthangarh despite an HC order to stop it on December 7 last.

On that day, the same bench also directed the local administration to stop the construction work to preserve the archaeological site. The court had passed the order in response to awrit petition filed by the HRPB.

Advocate Manzill Musthid appeared for the petitioner.

MV JAHAN MONI Confined engr still in dark about his son's birth


