Bangladesh's vast mangrove forest, the Sundarbans, is still another whopping 20 crore votes away from being crowned as a new natural wonder of the world, according to campaigners.

They say problems arise, as overwhelming number of the country's 150 million people does not have access to the internet or telephones, the only

If selected as a natural wonder, the Sundarbans is expected to improve the

country's national image and attract more tourists with other lasting economic benefits. But the world's largest mangrove

forest has long to go, as it contests does not have access to against the likes of Mount Kilimanjaro of Japan, the Grand phones, the only vehi-Canyon of United States, and the Cliffs of Moher in Ireland. The campaign-

> ers said most of these places are more widely known to the world and people of the areas outnumber us and have wider access to technologies. So, non-residence Bangladeshis should

come forward and campaign for the forest from their respective countries as well, they added. The new seven wonders of nature will be

declared on November 11 this year.
