

by Steed Malbranque. Charlie Adam pulled a goal back from the penalty spot for Blackpool four minutes from time but Sunderland held on for the away win.

Fulham meanwhile pulled themselves further away from the relegation dogfight with a 2-0 win over Stoke at Craven Cottage, American international midfielder Clint Dempsey scoring twice.

Dempsey opened his account on 33 minutes, sliding in to stab home Andy Johnson's low cross from point-blank range before adding his second from the penalty spot on 56 minutes.

Bayern Munich's Mario Gomez hit a hattrick as the defending champions went third in the Bundesliga with a 5-1 win over Kaiserslautern on Saturday as leaders Borussia Dortmund drew

1-1 with Stuttgart.

Despite being held, the leaders remain 13 points clear at the top with Bayern 14 points behind after Gomez netted

three second-half goals to bring his tally to 15 in 17 league matches this season.

It makes him the league's joint top-scorer with Freiburg's Papiss Cisse Demba.

"When we win 5-1, that is fantastic," said Bayern coach Louis van Gaal. "We had lots of problems in the first half, Kaiserslautern were very

disciplined and well organised. Bayern opened the scoring when Dutchman Arjen Robben latched onto a long pass from Germany star Thomas Mueller, held off a defender and beat Stuttgart goalkeeper Sven Ulreich with almost the last kick of the first-half.

Munich went 2-0 up straight after the break when Robben beat two defenders down the left wing, squared the ball to Bastian Schweinsteiger who offered his Germany team-mate Gomez the chance to tap

into an empty net.

Kaiserslautern pulled a goal back when Bayern defender Anatoliy Tymoshchuk made a hash of dealing with a cross and the loose ball fell into the path of Czech midfielder Jan Moravek in the 62nd minute who fired home.

But Gomez showed his class with two late goals before Mueller added the fifth in added time to complete the rout.

Dortmund had to share the points after

Stuttgart's Russia striker Pavel Pogrebnyak equalised in the 84th minute to stun the leaders at home.

Borussia had opened the scoring just before the halftime break when midfielder Kevin Grosskreuz slid a pass through the Stuttgart defence for teenager Mario Goetze to beat the goalkeeper on 43 minutes.

Stuttgart fought back for a point but are still 16th in the league, three from bottom, despite the

Van Gaal gives as good as he gets

The war-of-words between Bayern Munich president Uli Hoeness and coach Louis van Gaal escalated on Sunday when the Dutchman accused Hoeness of breaking his word.

On Saturday, Hoeness launched a thinly-veiled attack on van Gaal questioning his decision to drop veteran goalkeeper Hans-Joerg Butt for youngster Thomas Kraft.

But despite Bayern's 5-1 win at home to Kaiserslautern on Saturday, which puts them third in the German league, van Gaal could not hide his irritation.

"Uli Hoeness is the president and an icon of Bayern Munich, I will not contradict an icon, but if I have to tell the truth, that is another matter," van

Gaal told Munich newspaper Sueddeutsche Zeitung. "We agreed that any criticism should be done in-

house, but he has not stuck to that."

'Follow Berbatov's example'

Inter stalled at Udinese

Udinese ended Leonardo's perfect record since taking over as Inter Milan coach from Rafael Benitez with a 3-1 win over the Italian champions in a lively lunchtime match in Serie A on Sunday.

Inter, aiming for a sixth straight win since the Brazilian's arrival in the San Siro dugout, took the lead after quarter of an hour through Dejan Stankovic.

Udinese then stunned Inter with goals from Cristian Zapata and Antonio Di Natale to go into the break 2-1 up, with Maurizio Domizzi adding a third midway through the second half.

The result left Udinese treading water in eighth, although they made up ground to within one point of seventh-placed Palermo, while Inter remained fifth on 35 points, six adrift of leaders AC Milan. A sixth win here would have seen Inter climb to second

point ahead of Napoli and | and that looked on the cards when Thiago Motta pulled the ball back for Stankovic to fire past Udinese keeper Samir Handanovic in the 16th minute.

Inter though barely had time to savour their good fortune when the hosts were back on a level footing. After a failed Inter clearance from a corner the ball fell to

Zapata on the edge of the box with the Colombian defender shooting into the top corner of Luca Castelazzi's net. Four minutes later Udinese were in front.

And the man responsible was Serie A's top scorer Di Natale who took his tally to 15 with a superb freekick which dipped over the Inter wall and out of Castelazzi's reach.

Udinese, recording their first win over their illustrious visitors in 14 attempts, thwarted any hopes Inter may have had of leaving the Stadio Friuli with anything to show for their visit when Domizzi struck in the 69th minute.
