

PM says the proposed airport site to be shifted following a feasibility study

Against the backdrop of fierce protest from local residents against construction of an international standard airport in Arial Beel of Munshiganj, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said no airport will be built there against the will of the area's people.

"Awami League government is people's government and it won't do any-

thing going against their will," she said while justifying the need for a new airport of international standard for the country's development.

Chairing a weekly cabinet meeting in Bangladesh Secretariat, the premier said the site of the proposed airport will be shifted to another place after a feasibility study.

'UNKNOWN' DISEASE 8 more die in northern dists

Eight people, mostly children, of Hatibandha and Pirogachha upazilas of Lalmonirhat and Rangpur districts died of an "unknown disease" yesterday raising the death toll to 12 while 24 more patients are admitted to different hospitals.

Of the diseased, seven -- Gourob Roy, 2, Nishad, 3, Yasmin Akhter, 4, Ananya Ghosh, 4, Kajol Islam, 8, Sadequl, 22, and Azizul Islam, 32, -- are of Hatibandha and Tamanna, 4, is of Pirogachha.

On Tuesday, five people -- Sabina, Sajjad, Razzak Miah and Aranya Ghosh -- died of this disease in Lalmonirhat
