

Heart patients in agony

No supply of free drugs and medical equipment to govt cardiac hospital; treatment costs double in six months

Sixty-year-old Abdul Khaleq, a retired health ministry official, was admitted to National Institute of Cardiovascular Diseases (NICVD) on December 29th last year. Doctors advised him to go for stenting, a treatment for coronary artery blockages.

"Intensive lobbying earned me free rings, but the procedure costing more than Tk 1 lakh has been deferred for four times. And still I am in the dark of cost.

Though the government allocated a block amount (Tk 4 crore) for the hospital this year, suffering of the patients has escalated during the last six months as the authorities failed to supply emergency drugs and other medical equipment free

The 370-bed specialised public hospital gets almost the same allotment as that of the 1250-bed Dhaka Medical College Hospital, noted doctors.

The treatment costs at the country's largest cardiac hospital, however, have more than doubled.
