

A long line of best actress winners including Joan Crawford, Bette Davis, Halle Berry and Kate Winslet experienced the end of their marriages not long after taking home their awards, say researchers at the University of Toronto's Rotman School of Management and Carnegie

On the other hand, Best Actor winners like Jeff Bridges do not experience an increase in the risk of divorce after an Oscar.

"Research has shown that, in the general population, gender differences have historically given roles with greater power and status to men and roles with lesser status and power to women. Studies have demonstrated that breaching this social norm within a marriage for example, when a wife earns more than her

husband -- can strain the relationship," said Tiziana Casciaro, an assistant professor of organisational behaviour at the Rotman School, who co-authored the study with Colleen Stuart, a post-doctoral fellow at

The results show that Best Actress winners have a 63 percent chance of their marriages ending sooner than the marriages of non-

The median marriage duration for Best Actress winners was 4.30 years, substantially lower than the 9.51-year marriage duration for

By contrast, the difference between Best Actor non-winners (12.66 years) and Best Actor winners (11.97 years) was not statistically significant.
