Double blow for family

It is not only Hena's memory that haunts her family members. They are also deeply worried about repaying the loan taken for her treatment.

Hena's father Darbesh Kha, a day-labourer, borrowed Tk 40,000 to arrange her treatment, burial and other relevant expenses including food and conveyance, family members said.

Of the total loan, Tk 10,000 was taken from Brac Bank on condition to repay in

Fresh case to add 5 more charges

HC issues 8 directives for justice to the girl whipped to death, family

The High Court yesterday issued eight directives for the government, including filing of a fresh case in connection with teenaged girl Hena Akter's death by whipping following a fatwa in Shariatpur last month.

It ordered to bring five specific charges against the organisers of the fatwa, and to probe why there is a gulf of difference between two post-mortem reports.

Meanwhile, one of the main organisers of the deadly fatwa, Idris Ali Sheikh, was arrested by police from the HC premises yesterday, right after he appeared before the court responding to a summons.

An HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain ordered the superintendent (SP) of Shariatpur police and the officer-in-charge of Naria Police Station to arrest all organisers of the illegal fatwa and the subsequent arbitration where Hena was whipped.

It ordered them to bring charges of rape, abduction, unlawful assembly, conspiracy, and torture against the accused; and to

Shariatpur civil surgeon reads out injury details

As the Shariatpur civil surgeon yesterday read out in the High Court the fresh autopsy report citing injury marks all over Hena's body, people in the courtroom seethed with rage, some even shouted expletives.

Only nine days back, an autopsy conducted at Shariatpur Sadar Hospital did not find any internal and external injuries on the body of the 15-year-old girl allegedly flogged to death following a fatwa.

At that time, an inquest by the local police too did not report any abnormalities.

In response to news reports, the HC on Monday ordered exhumation of Hena's remains and a fresh autopsy. It also asked eight people, including those involved in the first autopsy, to appear before it yesterday.

3 Hazaribagh factories sealed

Owners held for use of toxic tannery waste in poultry, fish feed

The Department of Environment yesterday sealed three factories at the city's Hazaribagh and arrested its owners for using toxic tannery-waste in poultry and fish feeds.

A DoE team, in a surprise raid at MK Enterprise, Zeko Fine Leather and Amir Multi Food, found workers filling sacks with dried up tannery waste, said Monir Chowdhury, director (monitoring and enforcement) of the department.

They also seized around 190 tonnes of raw materials mixed with the toxic waste.

The arrested, Makbul Ahmed, Mamun, Kajol, Asaduzzaman, Samiul, and Swapan, were sued under Bangladesh Environment Conservation Act and sent to Hazaribagh Police Station.

The factories produced around 3-5 tonnes of poultry feed a day, said Monir Chowdhury.

He also said they had collected samples from the factories to send for the laboratory test.

Led by the DoE director, the team in association with Rab also found the factories polluting soil and air and


