Form guidelines to ensure rights of migrant workers

SAMReN urges Saarc

South Asian Migration Resource Network (SAMReN) yesterday urged South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (Saarc) to formulate guidelines to protect rights of South Asian migrant workers and for their welfare.

Saarc could be an appropriate forum to set a common guideline to overcome the challenges of migrant workers they are facing, they said.

They told a press conference organised by SAMReN, an organisation of South Asian migration researchers, at a city hotel. Prof Ravi Srivastava of Indian Jawaharlal University; Dr Jagannath Adhikari of Nepal Institute of Development Studies; Dr Rajith Lakshman of University of Colombo; LK Ruhunage of Sri Lanka Bureau for Foreign Labour Employment; and Dr CR Abrar, executive director of Refugee and Migration Movements Research Unit of Bangladesh; were present.

Dr Abrar placed some recommendations for the guidelines including declaration of minimum standard for migrant workers; abolition of sponsor system; formulation of a standard database of workers; investment in the migration sector; ratification of 1990 UN Convention on migrant workers; developing partnership between sending and receiving countries and keeping gender sensitivity in mind.

Govt to launch anti-fatwa campaign

The government will take necessary steps to launch a massive campaign against fatwa (religious diktat) to prevent fatwa-related crimes, State Minister for Religious Affairs Shahjahan Miah told parliament yesterday.

In reply to lawmakers' queries, the state minister said persons responsible for issuing fatwa are facing trial in line with the existing law.

"Besides, religious affairs ministry through the Islamic Foundation will launch a massive campaign across the country against fatwa to prevent fatwa-related crimes," Shahjahan Miah said.

The four principles are -- secularism, Bangalee nationalism, socialism and democracy.

He said that the words "Bismillah-Ar-Rahman-Ar-Rahim" and declaration of Islam as state religion will remain as

The HC in 2005 had cancelled the fifth amendment of the constitution, and the SC last year upheld the verdict with some modifications and observations.

GRAFT CASE AGAINST TAWFIQ HC scraps

The High Court (HC) yesterday quashed the proceedings against Prime Minister's Energy Adviser Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury in the barge-mounted power plant corruption case.

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) filed the case with Tejgaon Police Station on September 2, 2007 accusing Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, Tawfiq-e-Elahi Chowdhury and five others on charge of committing corruption in setting up the power plant in Khulna.

An HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain passed the verdict following a writ petition filed by Tawfiq challenging the proceedings of the case against him.

Following the writ petition, the HC on February 3, 2008 stayed the proceedings against him and issued a rule upon the ACC and the government to explain why the proceedings should not be quashed.

DCC evicts makeshift

Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) evicted makeshift structures from the pavements along Airport Road and in Mirpur area in the capital yesterday, as part of the ongoing drive against illegal occupancy on the eve of World Cup Cricket 2011.

Around 50 illegal structures were removed from the sidewalks stretching from the airport to Radisson Hotel, said Mohsin Uddin, estate officer of DCC. Quit from power Delwar asks govt

BNP Secretary General Khandker Delwar Hossain yesterday asked the government to quit from power immediately and hold midterm election so as not to increase public suffering. "Quit the power and hold a free and fair election as you

(ruling party) failed to run the country. You can run the coun-

try if you win the poll," he said while addressing a meeting at city's Muktangon organised to observe Malibagh Killing Day. The rally was disrupted for at least 10 minutes due to chaos by Juba Dal men following misbehaviour with their

president Moazzem Hossain Alal by a leader of Swechchasebak Dal, another body of BNP. But later senior BNP leaders brought the situation under control. Demanding punishment of Malibagh killers, Delwar said,

"Government withdrew seven thousand cases. All of these cases should be revived and listed criminals should be arrested." He said the prime minister says artificial crisis has been

created to hike prices of essentials but no action was taken against those who created these crises, as the ruling party shelters them all. Delwar also criticised the commerce minister for his recent remark that people of Bangladesh are getting essen-

tial commodities at lower price, saying the minister should disclose data of those countries so that people can understand the real situation.

Savar AL human chain foiled

BCL men released after arrest

Police yesterday foiled a human chain formed by a faction of Savar unit Awami League (AL) near Jatiya Press Club in the city demanding punishment to Savar Police Station officer-incharge (OC).

Meanwhile, Shahbagh Police Station OC Rezaul Karim said the detained BCL men, including Manjurul Alam Rajib, a former BCL central committee vice president, were released in the evening, after around eight hours of arrest.

Earlier, the Shahbagh OC said they picked some five to six BCL men from the human chain to avert any untoward incident, as there had an internal feud between two groups of local AL leaders and activists in Savar.

"One group tried to form a human chain while another group tried to foil it," OC Rezaul said.

Some AL and BCL leaders and activists led by former Lawmaker Ashrafuddin Khan Imu and Savar upazila unit AL president Hasina Dowla Savar formed a human chain in the morning demanding punishment to Savar OC Mahbubur Rahman for allegedly ransacking photos of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at the residence of Rajib on February 6.

Contacted, the Savar OC said the allegation of ransacking the photos of Bangabandhu and the prime minister is totally false.

Savar police also filed a case against 167 AL and BCL men, including Rajib for attacking the Police Station on February 6.
