7 get life for murder in Kishoreganj

A court here on Tuesday sentenced seven people to life term rigorous imprisonment (RI) and fined Tk 20 thousand, in default, to suffer one year more imprisonment in a sensational murder case at Bhairab.

The convicts are Asad Mia, 45, son of late Lal Mia, Sujan Mia, 28, son of late Muslim Mia, Khurshid Mia, 32, son of late Idris Mia, Kala Mia alias Kala Dakat, 40, son of late Musa Mia, Shahin Mia, 30, son of Shahjahan Mia, Jamshed Mia, 30, son of late Idris Mia, and Roni, 14, son of Asad Mia. They hailed from different villages of Bhairab upazila.

Of them six but Kala Mia are in jail.

According to prosecution, a gang entered the house of Faruk Mia of Jagannathpur village in Bhairab at dead of night on July 4, 2006 for looting valuables including gold ornaments. The criminals stabbed Faruk Mia and his wife Irine Begum as they tried to resist them. Later Faruk Mia died at hospital.

Another boy fined for stalking

Two sent to jail in separate case

A mobile court fined a school boy Tk 10,000 for stalking a schoolgirl in Tanore upazila on Monday.

Summon Chowdhury, Class X student of Tanore Pilot High School was awarded six months' imprisonment in case of his failure to pay the fine.

However, he was released upon payment of fine instantly before the court of the upazila nirbahi officer Mehdi-ul Hasan Shahid.

Sumon was convicted for intercepting and stalking a female student of Tanore Girls High School at around 11am.

He also manhandled the girl while returning home along with two other friends from a coaching centre.

Hearing the screams of the girl, locals rushed to the scene and caught Sumon. Police later arrested him and placed him before the

mobile court.

Sumon confessed to his offence before the court. He said the girl was previously known to him and she borrowed Tk 200 from him. The incident occurred after he wanted his money back.

In another incident on Friday, a mobile court in Chapainawabganj district fined a 12-year-old boy Tk 2,000 for teasing a girl student.

Police said, convict Rasel of Kalupur village under Jhilim union teased the school girl on her way to a coaching centre.

Parents of the girl caught the boy and handed him over to police. Later, a mobile court handed down the verdict.

In Patuakhali, Galachipa upazila Judicial Magistrate's Court on Monday sent two stalkers to jail on charge of sexually harassing a madrasa student on Pankhali Govt Primary School field under the upazila.

The stalkers are Md Reaz, 22, and his brother Md Zakir Hossain, 26, sons of Gedu Majhi of Pankhali village of the same upazila, reports our correspondent.

Police quoting family sources said, Md Reaz tried to forcibly take the 12-year-old student of class-VII of Coutkhali Dakhil Madrasa on his rickshaw while the girl along with her cousins was going to watch the annual sports programme at about noon on Sunday.

Hearing the hue and cry locals went to the spot and caught Reaz. In the meantime, Zakir Hossain and Milon, two brothers of Reaz came to the spot and snatched Reaz from locals.

Jamal Howlader, uncle of the victim, filed a case with Galachipa police station accusing the three brothers.

Later, two of them were arrested on Sunday evening from their house while Milon managed to avert arrest.

Few playgrounds, open spaces in Tangail town

Children in Tangail town are deprived of play and recreation facilities due to lack of sufficient playgrounds and open spaces.

Surprising though, no children's park was set up in the municipality that was established in 1887.

The situation is far from being conducive to smooth physical and mental development of the children, said a local resident.

The municipality comprising 18 wards and having a population of about two lakh has already turned into a concrete jungle in last few years due to indiscriminate

and unplanned construction of numerous houses and shopping malls.

Most of the children of the municipal areas do not know how to swim as there is no swimming pool and most of the water bodies and ponds in the municipal areas have already been filled up for construction work.

"My three school going children spend quite a long time watching television, especially Hindi serials in different channels, as there is no playground or open places near my house. I know it is not good for them but what can I do? Where will

they go for playing?" said businessman Anwar Hossain of Purba Adalatpara.

Torit Hasan Muyid, an organiser of children in the town, said majority of the children of the town attend private schools but most of them are without any playground or open space.

Besides, a large number of children working at tea stalls, hotels, restaurants, workshops, factories, shops and other places of the municipal areas have hardly any recreation facilities, he said.

Unplanned construction of numerous dwelling houses and commercial

structures across the municipal area ate up the open spaces while authorities seem reluctant about the necessity of children's play and recreation, said several senior citizens in the town.

However, Shahidul Rahman Khan Mukti, new mayor elect of Tangail municipality, said, "I and counsellors of the municipality are very much aware about the problem. We have already planned to set up parks and provide other facilities for children at different places in the municipal area within a very short time."

Headmaster hits on head of colleague with hammer

Headmaster of a primary school beat up his female colleague with a wooden hammer over a trifle issue on Tuesday.

The incident took place at Matigara village of Sadar upazila in Panchagarh district.

In protest, locals confined the headmaster to his office room for about three hours till police rescued him and took him to the police station.

Police said, before closing hour at about 4:00pm, Hira Bala, an assistant teacher of Matigara Registered Primary School, submitted an application to the headmaster of the school seeking casual leave (CL) for three days.

Headmaster Khademul Islam refused to entertain her application. An altercation took place between the two and a stage, the headmaster injured the teacher by hitting her on the head with a wooden hammer used for ringing school bell.

Within a few minutes, a large number of locals besieged the school to protest the matter.

Chairman of Gorinabari union parishad Shibben Sharma informed police to rescue the headmaster from the agitated mob.

Acting officer-in-charge of Panchagarh police station Habibur Rahaman said, "Hira Bala has filed a case against the headmaster with the police station and he will be produced before the Chief Judicial Magistrate Court on Wednesday."

District primary education officer (DPEO) Syeda Mahfuza Akhter said, "I am yet to be informed of the matter. If the victim files a complaint officially, departmental action will be taken."

Hizb-ut Tawhid man held with leaflets, jihadi books

Police arrested a member of Islamist outfit Hizb-ut Tawhid from Judge Court premises yesterday while he was distributing leaflets and jihadi books inviting people to join jihad (uprising).

Arrestee Moslem Ali, 41, is son of Moksed Ali Mistri of village Dadpurin Debhatap upazila.

Quoting eye witnesses police said, the arrestee was distributing leaflets on the court premises and trying to enter the courtroom.

Police recovered six books in cluding 'Dazzal' written by Humayun Khan Panni, the founder of the outfit, besides the CD and the leaflets.

He was produced before the judicial magistrate's court yesterday and the court sent him to jail.

Gang kills girl after rape in Sunamganj

A teenage girl was killed after rape by unidentified criminals at Adityapur village under Chhatak upazila of Sunamganj district early yesterday.

The victim, Mili Rani Das, 16, daughter of Porindra Chandra Das of Diritari Dehi village in Barlekha upazila of Moulvibazar, was staying at a house at Adityapur village rented by her uncle Joydev Das as his wife Doli Rani Das works as a field organiser of Grameen Bank at Jawabazar branch in Chhatak upazila.

Police quoted neighbours

as saying that the gang entered the house at Adityapur village at around 1:00am by breaking open door of the room in which Mili was asleep.

They raped Mili and hit on the head as she started screaming. They also hit Mili's aunt Doli Rani with a sharp weapon when she rushed to the room, hearing scream.

Being informed by neighbours, police reached the spot and took Mili and her aunt Doli to Koitak health centre at around 2:30am. Doctors of the hospital sent the two to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College and

Hospital around 3:00am where Mili was declared dead on arrival. Doli Rani is undergoing treatment at the hospital.

Police also recovered a cleaver from Mili's bed. Sub-inspector Nazrul Islam of Jawanbazar police investigation centre said they are waiting for autopsy report.

Doli Rani's husband Joydev, a schoolteacher in Moulvibazar, reached the village yesterday morning. He said he will file a case with the police station concerned, but no case was filed in connection with the incident as of filing of this report at 5:00pm yesterday.

COUPLES JOIN 'FAIR' IN DINAJPUR

Share ideas on removing gender discrimination

Hundreds of couples yesterday gathered at a 'gender mela' on the premises of Betora Dimukhi High School at Bhandara village in Biral upazila of Dinajpur district to share their experience on minimising gender discrimination in the rural society.

Society for Udyog, a non-governmental organisation of Dinajpur, arranged the day-long fair in cooperation with Manusher Jonno Foundation.

Women of rural area are now recounting their experiences regarding various developmental initiatives introduced across the country for the uplift of women and the society in general, speakers said at a discussion on the occasion.

The NGOs of the country are working on the people's right to education, right to

health and right to food with special emphasis on educating the girls of rural areas, they said, adding that such initiatives are helping to strengthen the rural economy.

"The women have gathered here to discuss the changes that various initiatives have brought about in their lives," Md Abdur Rahman, acting chairman of Bhandara union parishad, said.

"Crime against women sees a gradual decline while NGOs are working to make people aware about the harmful effects of female foeticide. Still the rate is concerning," Shahin Anam, executive director of Manusher Jonno Foundation, said in her speech as a special guest at the meeting.

After the discussion, five newly married couple were honoured for getting mar-

ried without dowry. It followed an oath to prevent people from committing any crime against women.

Dinajpur Deputy Commissioner Md Jamal Uddin Ahmed spoke as chief guest at the meeting presided over by Umme Nehar, executive director of Society for Udyog.

Md Golam Rabbani, upazila nirbahi officer of Biral, Bonosree Mitra Niyogi, programme coordinator of Manusher Jonno Foundation, Laila Arzuman Banu, vice chairman of Biral upazila, A K M Mohsinuzzaman, officer-in-charge of Biral, and Rita Mondal, upazila women affairs officer, spoke among others.

Later 13 stalls, meant for providing information to people, were opened.

The daylong programme concluded with a colourful culture programme.
