#### SQ Chy treatment order scrapped

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld its Chamber Judge's order staying the High Court order that asked the government to take steps for treatment of BNP leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury.

The seven-member bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice ABM Khairul Haque passed the order after disposing of a leave-to-petition filed by the government against the HC order.

The HC on January 3 directed government to take steps for treatment of the opposition lawmaker and also issued a rule upon the government to explain why it should not be directed to send him abroad for better treatment.

The Chamber Judge of the Appellate Division on January 4 stayed the HC order.

#### Tremor again

A mild tremor was felt in Bangladesh-India border region yesterday morning.

The quake, which measured 4.3 on the Richter Scale, took place at 11:36:42am, said a special bulletin of Met Office.

The distance of epicentre was 106 kilometres, east-southeast of Bangladesh Meteorological Department in the city's Agargaon.

However, there was no report of any casualty in the earthquake.

#### Victim injured by muggers dies

Police said around 17 teenaged muggers beat Parvez, 15, of Koratoli in the city's Khilkhet mercilessly when he resisted them from mugging at Nanda in the city's Badda. Later, locals admitted him to the hospital. A case was filed against 17 persons.

#### Valuables worth Tk 1cr gutted in fire

## Independent MP walks out of JS

Independent lawmaker Fazlul Azim, who was alone in the opposition bench, walked out of parliament yesterday protesting against not being allowed to speak.

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal legislator Mayeenuddin Khan Badal expressed resentment at the reluctance of ministers concerned to speak in parliament about the fate of Bangladeshi nationals in Libya. Fazlul Azim took the floor on a point of order but before he

could say anything, Deputy Speaker Col (retd) Shawkat Ali said he hoped the government would inform the House about the latest situation in Libya. Azim then started speaking and backed the JSD law-

maker's statement. At the beginning he pointed out wholesale absence of ministers in the House. He said even the foreign minister was absent. At that time, treasury bench Chief Whip Abdus Shahid

stood up and sought the floor. The deputy speaker switched off Azim's microphone and allowed the chief whip to speak. The chief whip opposed the discussion on Libya on point of

order and suggested that the deputy speaker runs the House as per the scheduled business of the House to "save time". After the chief whip's speech, the deputy speaker took up the next item on the agenda without giving floor to Azim.

The independent lawmaker was seen speaking loudly without microphone. Azim staged the walk out at 7:14pm and did not return yesterday.

#### BNP demo tomorrow

BNP will stage demonstration tomorrow across the country except Dhaka and Chittagong to protest the government decision to increase price of electricity.

"The power tariff hike will increase the essentials prices and the living cost of fixed income group which will deepen the social instability," said party standing committee member Khandaker Mosharraf Hossain while announcing the protest programme at a press briefing at party's central office in Nayapaltan.

Mosharraf, also a former energy and mineral resources minister, said they kept Dhaka and Chittagong cities free from the agitation considering the World Cup Cricket 2011.

Iqbal Hasan Mahmud Tuku and former secretary ANH Akhter Hossain, among others, were present.

## JS sitting adjourned for quorum crisis

Parliament sitting was adjourned as it fell short of a quorum last night, first since the ninth parliament began journey on January 25, 2009. "Honourable MPs, now I have to adjourn the sitting of

parliament for lack of a quorum," Deputy Speaker Col (retd) Shawkat Ali said at 9:08pm. Presence of lawmakers was thin at the beginning of the

session at 4:45pm, 15 minutes behind schedule. Around 9:00pm, it came down to 48, falling short by 12 to run session. Jatiya Party lawmaker Mujib-ul-Haque drew the chair's

attention to the quorum shortage. The deputy speaker adjourned the sitting till 4:30pm

Before calling it a day, he asked treasury bench whips

Mujibul Haque and Shaikh Abdul Wohab whether there was any possibility of a quorum to appear.

In response, Abdul Wohab said there is no scope to form the quorum and it will not be right to run the House amid

such situation. However, four MPs, who were in the lobbies, entered the chamber increasing the number to 52.

Awami League-led grand alliance has 302 of total 345 MPs in the Jatiya Sangsad. The AL alone has 268, Jatiya Party 29, JSD three and Workers Party two MPs. The BNPled opposition, which has been boycotting the House, has only 39 MPs.
