Felix's sweet revenge

Another piece of silverware slipped from Bayern Munich's grasp on Wednesday as the holders were dumped out of the German Cup after a 1-0 semifinal home defeat to Schalke 04, coached by former Bayern boss Felix Magath.

A first-half goal from Schalke's veteran Spaniard Raul means the Royal Blues will face second-division MSV Duisburg in the final at Berlin's Olympic Stadium on May 21. This is Bayern's second straight home

defeat and pressure is mounting on their coach Louis van Gaal with signs demanding 'Van Gaal out!' seen around the stadium.

The picture is now much bleaker exactly a week after the joy of Munich's 1-0 win at Inter Milan in the Champions League as Bayern are virtually out of the league race and now out of the cup.

Last Saturday's 3-1 defeat also at home to

Bundesliga leaders Borussia Dortmund has left Bayern 16 points off the pace with 10 games left and effectively out of the title race.

"Schalke improved their hand with the early 1-0 lead, then they closed up shop in defence," said disappointed Bayern captain Philipp Lahm.

"We just couldn't find a solution."

"When we won't be German champions and cup winners, that is not a good season for Bayern."

This was sweet revenge for Magath who was sacked by Bayern in February 2007, despite leading Munich to the league and cup double in the previous two seasons.

Raul added to Bayern's woes with his 15th goal of the season with a header in the 15th minute as it stayed 1-0 at the break.

Bayern poured on the pressure after the break with Dutch winger Arjen Robben just failing to connect with a Franck Ribery cross, while Schalke's Germany goalkeeper Manuel Neuer denied Bastian Schweinsteiger with a header.

But the terrorists could do nothing more as the law enforcers and armed forces reacted quickly. The joint team members rapidly moved to the ground. Police and Special Forces cordoned off the players and the umpires. Fire fighters doused the flame within

two minutes and rescued the injured. The Air Force helicopter landed at Women's Krira Complex ground adjacent to the stadium. The armed commandoes and Special Forces entered the ground one after another through the passageway and rescued the players.

Meanwhile the army tanks and other commandoes entered the VIP and VVIP gallery gate. The joint forces took control of the whole ground and the gallery within 10 to 15 minutes.

This was the scene at the Zohur Ahmed Chowdhury Stadium on Thursday during a dummy rehearsal for protecting the players, higher officials of ICC and BCB, VIP- VVIPs and above all the audience.

A total of 1500 members of joint forces participated in the dummy operation.

After the security drill CMP Commissioner Abul Kasem told journalists that the safety management rehearsal was completed for the World Cup matches to be held on March 11 and 14 at the ground.

"3,500 members of law enforcers will control the whole security system during the

matches in the port city", he added. The Commissioner said, "Situation inside the gallery and different boxes will be under close watch and monitoring through 58 CC cameras and the outside condition will be observed through other cameras from venue operation centre."

Argentine sensation Lionel Messi scored his 27th league goal of the season as champions Barcelona defeated Valencia 1-0 at the Mestalla stadium on Wednesday to move ten points clear of rivals Real Madrid at the Spanish first division summit.

Messi netted a 76th minute winner as Barcelona continued their unbeaten away

run and put Real under extra pressure to win at home to Malaga on Thursday. Ballon D'Or winner Messi had missed

several chances in the first half but came good 14 minutes from time

Adriano to clinch a vital win. It handed coach Pep Guardiola his first ever victory at the Mestalla, which had been the only top-flight venue where he had failed to secure three points.

reception from the home fans. Spanish international playmaker Xavi returned to the Barca starting line-up after recovering from his calf injury to join Javier

Mascherano and Sergi Busquets in midfield. Valencia decided to play with Juan Mata, normally a winger, leading the line and the hosts started at a high tempo to try and dis-

rupt Barcelona's possession game.

Eric Abidal and Dani Alves were both forced to make crucial clearances for Barcelona early on before the champions found their rhythm.

In the ninth minute Messi went clean through on goal but the Argentine fluffed a chance he usually buries on autopilot.

Messi had three chances to score but missed them all with goalkeeper Vicente Guaita, third choice at the beginning of the season, standing tall.

Valencia thought they had scored in the 20th minute but Jordi Alba's goal was ruled out for offside.

Just after the half hour mark Messi squandered another goalscoring opportunity

when his lob landed on the roof of the net with only Guaita to beat.

Villa and full back Adriano both went close before the interval but Barcelona went into the break frustrated at

the 0-0 scoreline. Substitute Roberto Soldado volleyed just wide in the 51st minute for Valencia's best chance of the match and Pablo Hernandez then curled

Barcelona a warning. The decisive goal came on 76 minutes

with Brazilian Adriano cutting the ball across goal for Messi to arrive on cue to guide in with his trusty left foot. Earlier Villarreal ended a run of four

league games without a win with a 1-0 home victory over promoted Hercules. Italian international forward Giuseppe

Rossi scored his 13th league goal of the season on 21 minutes to seal Villarreal's 11th home win of the campaign as they got back to winning ways after collecting two points from the last 12.

Bendtner fires Arsenal

Nicklas Bendtner scored a hattrick as Arsenal bounced back from their League Cup final disappointment to thrash Leyton Orient 5-0 and earn a place in the FA Cup quarterfinals here on Wednesday.

All eyes were on how Arsene Wenger's men would respond following defeat in the League Cup final to Birmingham, which denied them one chance of ending their sixyear trophy drought. The remain alive in England's premier

knockout competition and goals from Marouane Chamakh and Gael Clichy either side of Bendtner's hattrick set up a clash at Manchester United in the next round. Their League One opponents still have a

More than 50 league places separated the two teams but the minnows created their own chances.

But it was Arsenal's evening. They were even given a lift before kick-off when Cesc Fabregas, who was sidelined for the tie, revealed he could return from a hamstring injury at the weekend.

Fabregas had been rated as a doubt for next week's Champions League clash against Barcelona, but wrote in his programme notes: "Perhaps I'll have a chance for Saturday (against Sunderland). I am running, getting better and don't sense any pain at the moment."

Fabregas was hoping his team-mates would keep the club in the FA Cup to give him a chance of lifting a trophy at the end of the season, having missed Sunday's final against Birmingham. They needed an early goal to settle their

nerves after the weekend and Chamakh provided it in the seventh minute. Tomas Rosicky created the opener, speeding past Charlie Daniels on the right
