## Green light to toxic ships

## US pledges help

The USA yesterday pledged \$5 million for repatriation of Bangladeshi migrants and other foreign nationals, who remain stranded in Tunisia and Egypt after escaping from Libya.

"On behalf of the American people, I am glad to announce our assistance and support to so many Bangladeshi citizens in need," said the US Ambassador to Bangladesh, James F Moriarty.

These funds will enable the International Organization for Migration (IOM) to fly thousands of Bangladeshis out of North Africa, he said in a statement yesterday.

Nearly 20,000 Bangladeshis remain stranded on Egyptian and Tunisian borders of Salum and Ras Adjir. They along with other foreign nationals fled Libya after labour camps came under attack amid clashes between forces loyal to Libya's ruler Muammar Gaddafi and the rebels.


Calls for unity to foil it
