During the meeting at the Prime Minister's Office, Sheikh Hasina and Ambassador Zhang also discussed bilateral issues including trade and business.

Committee to revise Appellate **Division rules formed**

Headed by Justice Md Muzammel Hossain, a senior judge of the Appellate Division, the committee consists Justice SK Sinha, Justice MA Wahhab Miah and Justice Nzmun Ara Sultana, also judges of the apex court.

There is no time limit on the committee to complete the job, sources said.

Dhaka-Delhi border co-ordination meet begin

Border guards of India and Bangladesh yesterday began five-day discussions on issues related to joint verification of unfenced gaps, maintenance of status quo in areas of adverse possession of land and implementation of joint border management plan.

Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) Chief Major General Rafiqul Islam, heading a 20-member team, discussed the issues with Indian Border Security Force (BSF) Director General Raman Srivastava, who heads a 23-member delegation, at the BSF headquarters here.

The five-day meeting will discuss issues of transborder crimes and killing of Bangladeshi civilians in firing by BSF along the border.

A joint memorandum will be signed by both the forces on March 12 and a joint media interaction by Maj Gen Islam and Srivastava is likely on March 12.

'Include Haijans, Dalits in census'

Upazila parishads not empowered: Dy Speaker

Deputy Speaker Col (retd) Shawkat Ali yesterday said the chairmen and vice chairmen of Upazila Parishads fail to carry out duties, as the parishads have not been empowered yet.

Expressing his dissatisfaction over the current situation, he also said upazila parishad election and related activities have been done without adequate preparation.

The deputy speaker made the remarks at

a national level meeting titled "Decentralisation of finance: past, present, and future" organised by Rupantar, an NGO. Rupantar executive director Rafiqul Islam

moderated the programme held at the National Institute of Local Government at Agargaon in the city, says a press release.

Shawkat Ali said apart from establishing people's control in local development work, participation of the mass people in local government system has to be increased.

He said it will be impossible to empower local government institutions effectively without decentralising finance.

"Union Parishad is the closest organisation to the people, but it is still extremely neglected and remained ineffective," he said. USAID Mission Director Dennis Rollins

said the government has to properly plan the financial decentralisation to make the local government bodies more self-reliant. They stressed formulation of a policy for

financial decentralisation and said no significant step is implemented despite the government's vow to strengthen local bodies. They also said lawmakers speak about

strengthening local government in rallies or discussion, but not in the parliament. Ashraf Ali Khan Khasru MP, Mir Shawkat

Ali Badsha MP, Nani Gopal Mandal MP, Nazrul Islam Manzu MP, Sohrab Ali Sana MP, and Swapan Guha, another executive director of Rupantar, were among the speakers.

ROOF-TOP CONSTN ON SCBA BLDG

Some lawyers stop police from enforcing HC order

A section of lawyers of the Supreme Court yesterday obstructed police who went there to stop construction on the roof of Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) office building.

A police team went to the SCBA building around 11:30am to prevent erecting rooms on the 50-year old building as per a High Court directive, according to some lawyers.

The pro-BNP lawyers then brought out a procession on the SCBA premises protesting entry of police and chanted slogans against the judges of HC, who passed the order. An HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury

Manik and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain on March 6 issued a suo moto order directing Public Works Department (PWD) to immediately stop the construction. It also issued a rule upon the authorities concerned of

government and SCBA president and secretary to explain why the construction should not be declared illegal. The order came following a report of The Daily Star head-

lined "SCBA erecting rooms on old building 'illegally'". Dr Belal Hossain Joy, a SC lawyer, placed the report seek-

ing an HC directive to stop the construction. SCBA President Khandker Mahbub Hossain told reporters that police entered the SCBA premises illegally and with-

out permission from the chief justice or him. Police cannot interfere with the SCBA's constriction, which is now a subjudice matter, he said.

SCBA Secretary Bodruddoza Badal told The Daily Star that they have already finished the construction of structures, and there is no effectiveness of the HC order.

PWD's Chief Engineer Dewan Mohamad Yamin, however, said a team of PWD yesterday stopped the work of vertical

extension of SCBA building. "We stopped the construction works following the High Court order," he said.

Optimum press freedom exists in country: Hasina

Prime Minister (PM) Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the present government ensured optimum level of press freedom.

The present Awami League government believes in freedom of press and expression, she said when chief editor of Ananda Bazar Group of Publications, Kolkata Avik Sarkar and his wife called on her at prime minister's office (PMO).

Briefing reporters after the meeting, PM's Press Secretary Abul Kalam Azad said the PM recalled the help and assistance of the then Indian government, its people and the Indian soliders who gave their lives during the War of Liberation.

Court directs exhuming Redwanul's body

A Dhaka court yesterday directed the district magistrate of Pirojpur to take an initiative to exhume the body of Dhaka University student Md Redwanul Islam to ascertain whether he died in a road crash.

Redwan's friends claimed that he was allegedly beaten by a group of Himalaya Paribahan staff and was later pushed under a running truck in Motijheel that caused his death.

Chief Metropolitan Magistrate AKM Enamul Haque passed the order of exhumation after Motijheel Police Station Sub Inspector Samir Chandra Sutradhar, also investigation officer of the case, submitted a petition on Tuesday.

Meanwhile, DU Vice-Chancellor Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique has handed over a cheque of Tk 2 lakh to Md Alauddin, Redwan's father, at a function held at his residence yesterday.


