### AKHAURA-AGARTALA RAIL LINK

# Work to start by year-end

Dhaka and Delhi are set to construct a 10kilometre railway track late this year directly linking Akhaura with Agartala by next year to facilitate transit for India, communications ministry officials say.

India has linked Agartala with its railway network in the northeast region. With the establishment of the new link, Tripura and part of Northeast India will be connected to the Chittagong Port through railway.

Communications ministry officials say the new rail link, to be constructed with Indian grant, will open up huge opportunities for both the countries in trade, tourism and communications.

India will be able to transport goods through the tracks by using the seaport,

while Bangladesh will gain financial benefit by charging them for using the railway and port facilities.

Delhi has been pressing for the rail link as it will also reduce distance between Agartala and Kolkata by nearly three times. The distance between Agartala and Kolkata via Guwahati is around 1,200 km.

However, the rail link is mainly aimed at freight services.

There is also a road link between Akhaura of Brahmanbaria and Agartala of Tripura. The Dhaka-Agartala bus service, introduced in 2003, operates through the route irregularly hardly bringing any benefit out of it.

The two countries have already finalised alignment of the rail tracks and are now determining construction cost as **SEE PAGE 12 COL 4**

# Boy survives 7-storey fall

The domestic help claims to be pushed over by employers

A minor domestic help cheated death yesterday after falling from a seven-storey building while trying to escape from the house he was confined to on charge of theft in Wari in the capital.

Nine-year-old Shahidul Islam was seriously injured and is struggling for life at Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Son of day labourer Abdul Khaleq of Kurigram,

Shahidul was serving in the house of fabrics businessman Motiur Rahman Montu of Larmini Street for last one month at Tk 600 a month. Although he was only nine years old, he had to keep

clean the stairs of the entire seven-storey building, his housemaster's flat on the fifth floor, the roof and the utensils. Locals say the boy was kept confined for allegedly

fleeing off the house stealing some money. They add although he fell from the top of the seven-

storey building, he survived as he first fell on some **SEE PAGE 13 COL 5** 

## Dutch make India sweat

Yuvraj Singh scored a match-winning 51 not out as India pulled off a five-wicket win against a spirited Netherlands after ICC Cricket World Cup making heavy weather of a small target in the World Cup on Wednesday.

Chasing 190 under lights, India were reeling at 99-4 after a three-wicket burst by left-arm spinner Pieter Seelaar but scraped through with 81 balls to spare before a packed Firoz Shah Kotla Stadium.

Yuvraj, who also grabbed two key wickets, has come to India's rescue twice in as many games after starring with both the bat and the ball against Ireland on Sunday.

The win maintained India's near-perfect run in the tournament and virtually assured them of a place in the quarterfinals with two more league matches to go.

### 37 killed as Pak funeral attacked

A Taliban suicide bomber attacked a funeral in northwest Pakistan yesterday, killing 37 people in the latest in a string of Islamist militant attacks. The funeral was for the relative of a pro-government,

ethnic Pashtun tribal elder near the northwestern city of Peshawar, top district administrator, Siraj Ahmed, told Reuters.

The attacker struck as mourners were about to hold funeral prayers, officials and survivors said.
