Nato allies vow not to rush for Afghan exit

Nato allies agreed yesterday new rules under which they can withdraw their troops from Afghanistan as US Defence Secretary Robert Gates slammed "too much talk about leaving."

Alliance Secretary General Anders Fogh Rasmussen announced the deal looking ahead to a 2014 deadline to pass control to Afghan security forces after Gates warned that early withdrawal would jeopardise the war effort just as the Taliban has lost the upper hand.

"Frankly, there is too much talk about leaving and not enough talk about getting the job done right. Too much discussion of exit and not enough discussion about the fight," Gates said according to a text of his speech.

"Too much concern about when and how many troops might redeploy, and not enough about what needs to be done before they leave," he said.

"Ministers discussed and agreed principles by which we will (manage) transition," Rasmussen said after talks among the 28 Nato countries and International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) partners, not all of whom contribute soldiers.

He said that while the gradual "thinning out" of ISAF forces in particular provinces it is likely to follow next year.

would accelerate, "redeployment and reinvestment ... remains a Nato responsibility."

Rasmussen said there had to be "coherence" so that "national decisions take into account overall force requirements."

That would mean "relocation" for some troops on active duty, although forces would remain in the line of fire "not a day longer" than needed, and "reconfiguration" for others, whereby "combat forces could be moved into training."

Afghan President Hamid Karzai said earlier this week that "five to six places" would be handed over initially.

"The final decision will be made by President Karzai," Rasmussen said of the formal announcement due on March 21, the first day of the Afghan New Year.

"I have seen a lot of speculation in the media but we fully respect the procedure laid out," Rasmussen added of areas that could include three cities -- Lashkar Gah, Herat and Mazar-i-Sharif -- and two provinces, Bamiyan and Panshir, plus the capital region of Kabul minus Surobi.

According to a Nato European military official, early withdrawal plans by Canada and the Netherlands gave "a very poor signal" and Germany has already made known

Iran expels AFP journalist

Iranian authorities expelled Agence France-Presse deputy bureau chief in Tehran Jay Deshmukh yesterday without giving any official explanation for their decision.

Deshmukh, a 40-year-old Indian national who had been in the country since January 2009, was stripped of his press card along with 10 other correspondents on February 15, a day after a major Tehran protest.

The demonstration was the most significant one in the Iranian capital in a year and was covered by AFP and most of the international media.

AFP chief executive Emmanuel Hoog lodged an official protest with the Iranian authorities, in Tehran and Paris.

Iraq Kurds protest, man tries to set himself ablaze

A protester tried to set himself on fire in Iraq's semi-autonomous northern Kurdish zone yesterday, where demonstrators have camped out on a square to call for the ouster of the powerful regional administration.

Protests were also held in several other Iraqi cities, although numbers were smaller than in previous weeks and there was no major violence.

Nasik Qadir, spokeswoman for protesters in the Kurdish city of Sulaimaniya, said one demonstrator had doused himself in kerosene and tried to set himself ablaze. He was rescued by other demonstrators and suffered no major injuries.

Such acts have taken on grave symbolism in North Africa and the Middle East since a Tunisian vegetable seller set himself on fire in December, triggering the uprising in that country which has spread to Egypt, Libya, Bahrain and other countries.

Several thousand people gathered in Sulaimaniya chanting for the ouster of regional President Masoud Barzani and carrying pictures of protesters killed in recent weeks.

"There has been no response from the government. We are here to change the despotic system, end the corruption in Kurdistan," said Qadir. "People feel the corruption and want jobs, justice and services."

Popular anger in the Kurdish region has been directed at a regional government which enjoys near-total autonomy, dominated for decades by two political parties whose former rebel guerrilla armies have been converted into security forces.

In the regional capital Arbil, supporters of Barzani drove through the capital honking horns and waving flags. Addressing a rally of the two ruling parties, Barzani said: "You cannot bring about change illegally... The opposition represents the minority and we as the authorities represent the majority of the people."

Portugal vows to tighten austerity measures

Finance Minister Fernando Teixeira dos Santos announced yesterday that Portugal will tighten its austerity measures to ensure it meet its deficit reduction targets, hours ahead of a summit on the eurozone debt crisis.

"We are going to reinforce the measures to reduce planned expenditures in 2011 in order to open up a supplementary margin which will guarantee in an even stronger manner attaining the target of a public sector deficit of 4.6 percent" of gross domestic product, he said.

Bahrain police fire tear gas at protesters

Bahraini police fired tear gas at anti-government protesters yesterday as they tried to prevent clashes with armed loyalists and as tensions soared in the tiny Gulfkingdom.

Thousands of demonstrators chanted slogans against the king as they marched toward a square near the royal palace in Manama where a group of pro-regime loyalists waited with clubs, swords and metal pipes.

The mainly Shiite anti-regime demonstrators hurled stones at riot police who responded with tear gas, according to an AFP reporter at the scene.

Some of the protesters had earlier offered flowers to the police and chanted "Peacefully, peacefully!" to ensure the demonstration did not descend into violence.

In the nearby Refaa area, the pro-government group chanted "The people want Khalifa bin Salman," referring to the long-time prime minister whose ouster the opposition demands.

"Long live the Bahraini monarchy," they yelled.

Many carried weapons including golf clubs and sticks with knives and nails embedded in them, in an ominous show of intent toward the mainly Shiite activists who

Russia bans Libya arms exports

Russia, a key arms exporter to the Middle East, announced yesterday it was banning the sale of all weapons to Libya, in line with its support of UN sanctions against Muammar Gaddafi's regime.

President Dmitry Medvedev signed a decree banning the "export, sale and delivery to Libya... of all kinds of weapons and associated materials," the Kremlin said in a statement.

The decree also stipulates that all cargo bound for or from Libya will be carefully inspected if there is "information that gives reason to believe that the cargo carries material subject to the ban."

The move comes after Russia joined other UN Security Council permanent members in ordering an arms embargo against Libya and other sanctions against Kadhafi's family.

Biden backs pro-Western reform in Moldova

Vice President Joe Biden yesterday made the highestranking US visit ever to the ex-Soviet state of Moldova, signalling Washington's support for pro-Western reforms in Europe's poorest country.

Wrapping up a threenation Europe tour, Biden told Moldova's liberal leaders its future lay with Europe and showed support for their efforts to end a protracted political and economic crisis.

"We are grateful to the United States for its support, for being with us during our 20 years of independence."
