# 3,092 to back home in couple of days

Foreign minister flies today to oversee repatriation

At least 3,092 Bangladeshis, who have fled to Egypt from strife-torn Libya, will be repatriated in a couple of days, Foreign Secretary Mijarul Quayes said yesterday.

Around 16,000 Bangladeshi nationals, who have taken refuge in Tunisia, will be brought back home by next week, the secretary told reporters in the afternoon.

Quayes was to leave for Egypt last night and Foreign Minister Dipu Moni is expected to fly there this morning to oversee the repatriation.

# Bangla rules for SC on cards

The Supreme Court authorities have taken an initiative to interpret the existing rules of its Appellate Division in Bengali in an effort to show respect to the mother tongue and the language heroes and also for making it easy to understand.

The 98-page rules were framed in English in 1988 determining the conducts of judges and lawyers and functioning of different units of the apex court, SC sources said.

The SC will do the same for the rules of the High Court Division after adding necessary amendments.

Chief Justice ABM Khairul Haque has formed a fourmember committee on Wednesday to do the needful for interpreting the Appellate Division rules, added sources.
