





Subsidy in farm, energy to go up

Budget implementation report placed at JS

Though the revised budget will see an increase in subsidy in agriculture, food and energy, it might be slashed by about three percent due to a shortfall in the Annual Development Programme (ADP) implementation.

The size of the revised budget was projected at Tk 128,645 crore with a cut of Tk 3,525 crore from the original outlay. Finance Minister AMA Muhith yester-

day placed a report in the parliament on the budget implementation situation, and the state of the economy in the first six months of the current fiscal year.
