



THEY RETURN, LEAVING A NIGHTMARE BEHIND

Libyan conflicts have forced thousands of Bangladeshis flee. After travelling long journeys from various parts of the North African country, they took refuge in the camps or under the open sky at Choucha at Tunisia-Libya border and Ras Adjir in Egypt. They wait for hours in queues when the international or local organisations distribute food. On arrival at the Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport, they break into tears in sorrows of their sufferings or in joy of returning home and seeing their loved ones. Some relatives, after waiting for the whole day to receive the migrant relatives, return home. Some also cry among themselves to share the same hardships in Libya or in the border camps of Egypt and Tunisia where they had barely enough food to eat and almost no water to drink in the desert.
