# Beautiful Bangladesh



Perhaps it was at that moment that around 25,000 Bangladeshis at the opening ceremony of the ICC Cricket World Cup 2011 [February 17] and millions of their fellow citizens honestly felt proud to belong to this 'school of life'. 

This video proves that there indeed is a 'school of talent' in this country. With the world cup being held here and the spotlight on us, maybe it's high time we show the world just how


## Bangabandhu's 91st Birth Anniversary
