Climate scientists' meet ends

A three-day meeting between international climate scientists on Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) report ended Friday at Brac Centre in Savar.

Over 30 scientists from nine countries, including China, Russia and Japan participated in the meeting, says a press release.

The scientists include authors and editors from IPCC's Working Group II, which is tasked with examining the impacts of climate change.

"Bangladesh is the most vulnerable country to the effects of climate change because of its geography, population density and poverty.

We need scientism guidance to help us and this meeting is an exciting beginning," said the release signed by Dr Atiq Rahman, a development expert and executive director of the Bangladesh Centre for Advanced Studies.

HC asks govt for SC judges' remuneration

The High Court yesterday issued a rule upon the government to explain within three weeks why it should not be directed to implement recommendations of the parliamentary sub-committee concerned to increase salaries and allowance of Supreme Court judges.

The HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik and Justice Sheikh Md Zakir Hossain issued the rule following a writ petition filed by two SC lawyers, Manzill Murshid and Asaduzzaman Siddiki.

A parliamentary sub-committee in January last year recommended making the salaries and other privileges for the chief justice Tk 1.52 lakh, for each of the Appellate Division judge Tk 1.20 lakh and for each of the High Court judges Tk 1.08 lakh per month, the petitioners said.

He said some 424 Bangladeshi nationals are scheduled to return home yesterday and another 300 to return today. With this, he said the number of reported returnees from Libya would total 30,225.

COL TAHER'S TRIAL

Judgement tomorrow

High Court (HC) yesterday fixed tomorrow for delivering judgement on the writ petitions challenging the two sons, two daughters trial of Colonel Abu Taher and some other freedom His qulkhwani will be fighters through a military tribunal in 1976.

The HC bench of Justice AHM Shamsuddin Chowdhury Manik and Justice Sheikh MD Zakir Hossain fixed the date after concluding the hearing of the petitions.

A military court in July 1976 tried Taher and sixteen others including politicians Sirajul Alam Khan, ASM Abdur Rab, Maj (retd) Zia Uddin, Hasanul Huq Inu, Sharif Nurul Ambia and Mahmudur Rahman Manna on mutiny and treason charges.

Taher's wife Lutfa Taher, his brother Anwar Hossain and Fatema Yusuf, wife of Yusuf Ali Khan, who was given life sentence by the military court, jointly filed the writ petition on August 22 last year. On August 23 last year, the

HC issued a rule asking the government to explain why the military regulation under which Taher was tried and executed should not be declared illegal and unconstitutional.

Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal President Hasanul Huq Inu and Vice President Rabiul Alam, Maj (retd) Zia Uddin and Abdul Majid, who were also tried and punished by the same military tribunal

filed three other writ petitions with the HC on similar grounds in January this year.

The HC on different days in January also issued separate rules on the government.

During hearings on the rules, a number of senior lawyers placed submissions before the court as amicus curiae (friend of court), saying that the trial of Taher and others was illegal and unconstitutional.

The trial and execution of Taher was a murder in the name of trial and Ziaur Rahman was responsible for it, most of the amicus curiae said.
