
















## A Mosaic of Feminine Visions

Group art exhibition at Drik

A group art exhibition, titled "Women in Nature", featuring works of Mafruha Begum, Afroza Anjum and Kamrun Nahar, is on at Drik Gallery in Dhaka. Cultural personality and lawmaker Asaduzzaman Noor inaugurated the exhibition as chief guest. Professors at the Printmaking Department, Faculty of Fine Arts (FFA), University of Dhaka -Mahmudul Haque and Abul Barq Alvi were present as special guests.

The featured painters are former students of the Institute of Fine Arts (presently FFA). Featuring diverse women's issues and nature in its unadulterated glory, the exhibition is a tribute to the late artist Rawjatun Zannat Champa who passed away a few has a similarity with oriental art but years ago. The exhibition also marks International Women's Day.

The works on display share some common themes, as the painters seek to focus on women and their perspectives. The artists have mainly highlighted women in their diverse dispositions. Afroza Anjum's paintings have a touch of reality in the present social context. Immature illustration, often take away from the aesthetics of her works and most of the figures in her paintings are drawing-based. There is a certain amateurish look to her works. Her artworks address loneliness and woes faced by women. At the exhibition, one of Anjum's paintings shows a woman carrying a pitcher in a serene atmosphere. Her mode of expression


sharpness and delicate lines are missing. The painter now works at Bangladesh Agriculture Research Institute as a senior reprographic officer. Kamrun Nahar's presentation of lines

(outlines of figures), subdued colours and

forms construct contemplative women, moon, quiet sky, flowers as well as a range of lights and shades. With delicate touches of colours and minimal strokes, the artist has formed dreams and reality with intensity and imagination. She portrays women and their personal journeys through their evocative looks.

The collective work, however, seem to lack personal hallmarks or any certain style which is very significant for a painter. The painters should concentrate more on their preferred areas and technical aspects.

The exhibition ends on March 23.


