The International Crimes Tribunal will amend its rules of procedure to ensure fair trial of the crimes against humanity committed in 1971, tribunal Registrar Md Shahinur Islam has said.

"The tribunal is considering setting up a unit to provide support and protection to the witnesses and victims of war crimes," he said at a press briefing at his office yesterday.

Shahinur said the tribunal is compe-

tent enough, and is empowered by the International Crimes Tribunal Act to amend its rules of procedure any time.

Highlighting last one year's activities of the tribunal before newsmen, he said the tribunal is maintaining international standard in its proceedings.
