485 out of 656 centres identified as risky

Khulna district police have identified 485 out of 656 polling centres in 68 unions of nine upazilas as vulnerable as they are all located in outlaw-infestedareas.

Thirty-nine union parishads under five upazilas of the district will go to polls on March 29 while the remaining 29 unions in four upazilas on April 3.

The total number of voters in 68 unions now stands at 10,74,249, said District Election officer Bibhore Kumar. The last UP elections in the district were held from January to March they said. in 2003.

As many as 1200 policemen will be deployed in 39 unions of five upazilas of the

March 29 while 900 policemen will remain on duty in the polling centres during elections to 29 union parishads under four other upazilas on April 3.

Meanwhile, law and order situation in Khulna district is gradually deteriorating centring the upcoming UP elections.

Some UP candidates on condition of anonymity told this correspondent that many outlaws wanted by police are still at large. Besides, many outlaws have come out of Jail on bail under political influence centring UP elections,

Boro farmers agitate for smooth power supply

"We have informed the REB (Rural Electrification Board) officials of the matter several times, but to effect," the farmers alleged. They urged the authorities concerned to take immediate measures to improve the situation. Otherwise, they said boro cultivation in the upazila will face a setback

Sources in the Agriculture Extension Department (AED) said a total of 7,020 hectares of lands have been brought under boro cultivation in Atghoria upazila. "Boro fields in the upazila Farmers cannot irrigate their boro fields properly due to power crisis, sources

added.

35 injured in pre-election clashes in 2 districts

At least 35 people were injured in clashes between the supporters of rival candidates in the upcoming elections to union parishad in Patuakhali and Barguna districts on Friday.

In Patuakhali, the supporters of two member candidates for Kalishury Union Parishad under Baufal upazila clashed at Hizbillah Bazar at around 6:00pm, leaving at least 10 people from both sides injured.

Locals said Hiron Mridha's men swooped on his rival candidate Kazi Shawkat while he was addressing a rally at the bazar. His supporters made a counter attack, leading to a clash between the two sides.

Eight of the injured, including Kazi Shawkat, were admitted to Baufal Upazila Health Complex while the rest given first aid. Kazi Shawkat was later shifted to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College and Hospital as his condition deteriorated.

In Barguna, the supporters of two chairman candidates in the election to Charduani Union Parishad under Malek, 29, Salam, 25, Zakir, 33 and Patharghata upazila locked in a clash during campaign at South Charduani village at around 8:00pm.

Police and locals sources said when the ruling party backed candidate Firoz Alam along with his supporters were seeking votes at south Charduani village, his rival BNP backed candidate Kamrul Islam accompanied by his supporters went to the same area to woo votes.

Locals said the supporters of the two chairman aspirants chanted slogans and counter slogans during the cam-

paign and at one stage they attacked each other, leaving at least 20 people from both sides injured.

Of the injured, Kalam Mridha, 45, Shahjahan, 35, Amir Ali, 40, Kanchan Ali, 38, Rafiqul Islam, 32, Mujibur 22, Hanif, 30 are undergoing treatment at local hospitals while the rest took first aid.

In Kathaltali Union under the same upazila, at least five people were injured as the supporters of chairman candidate Habibur Rahman attacked his rival candidate Shahidul Islam's men at 6:00pm. Two of the injured--Badsha, 35, and Khaleq Khalifa, 36, admitted to Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College and Hospital while the remaining two given first aid at a local clinic.
