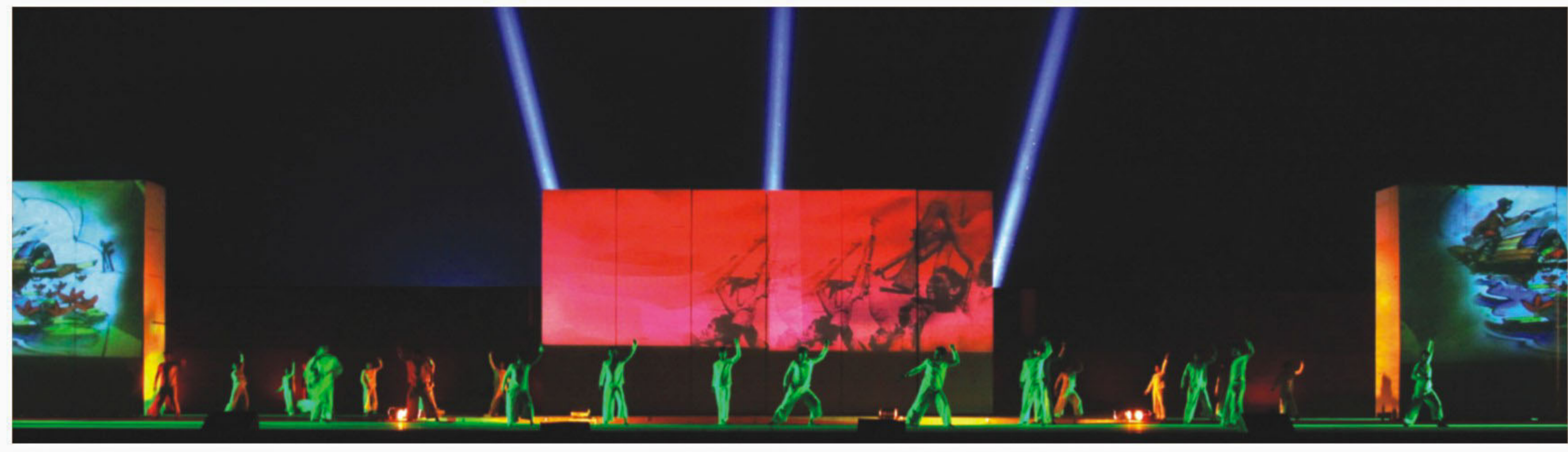

Enlisted singers of the academy Indramohon Rajbangshi, Shamim Chowdhury Shyamol, Yasmin Fairuz, Tahsin Khan, Chhaya Rani Karmakar, Kalyani Ghosh and Salma Chowdhury, among others, rendered patriotic songs at the programme. Golam Sarwar recited poems, while members of Shat Rang and Benuka Academy of Fine Arts performed dances. ## IMAGES OF LIBERATION Photo exhibition and film festival in Barisal

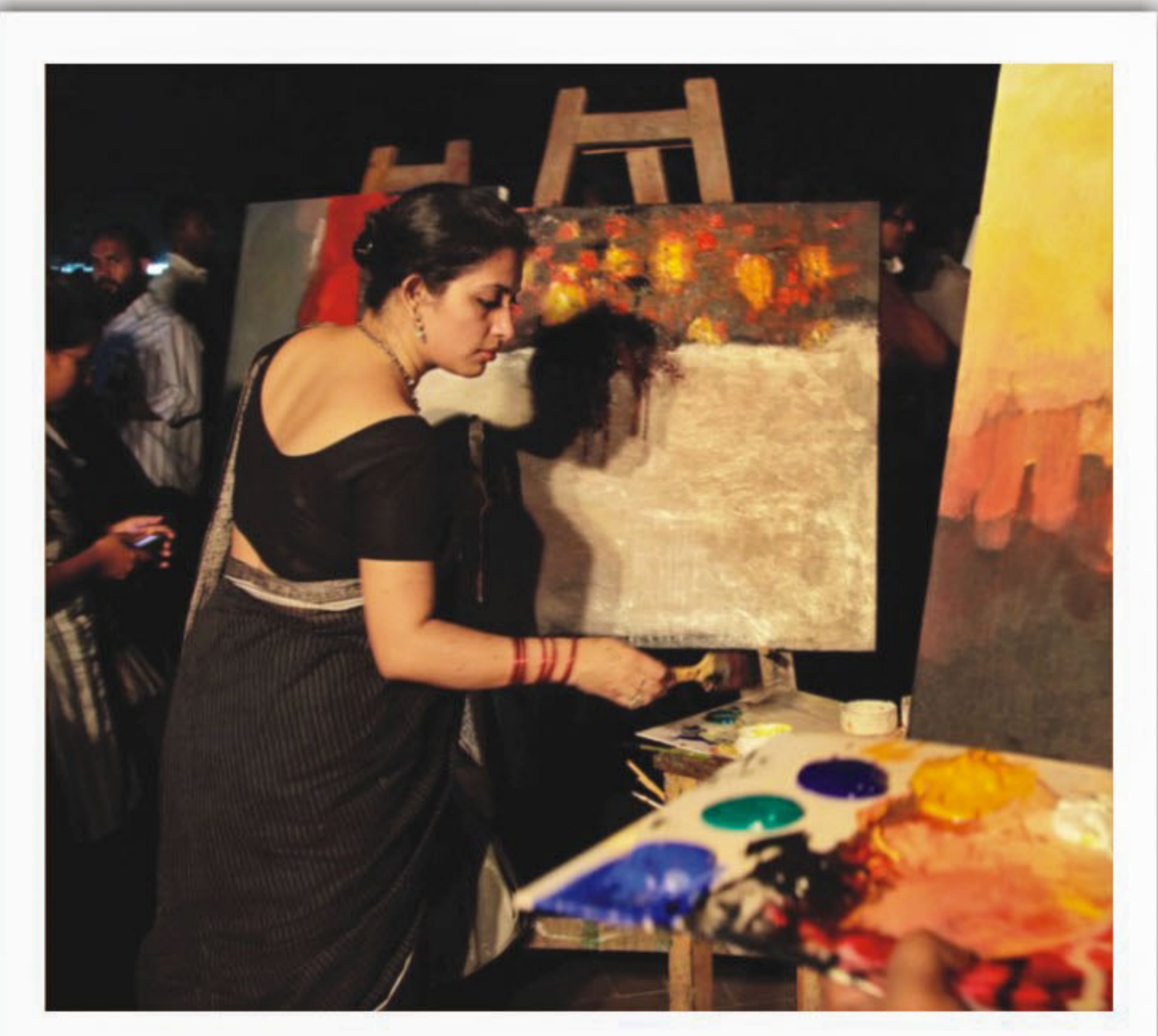

Liberation War Museum has arranged a weeklong programme at its premises in Shegunbagicha, Dhaka to celebrate the 40th anniversary of Independence. The weeklong programme began on March 22 and will continue till tomorrow. On March 25, the programme featured a discussion, recitation and rendition of songs. Cultural personality and trustee of the museum, Sara Zaker, gave the welcome speech at the programme. The discussion featured opinions of young individuals on genocide and trial of war criminals.
